Annual Battle

Fremont and Sandusky annually battle it out for top honors in Northwestern Ohio and this year should be no exception. Last year Ross finished up third in the state swimming meet while the Sandusky mermen took 10th place.

Sandusky already has competed in one dual meet. It hosted Lakewood last week and lost out by just three points 39 to 36. Last year the Rangers from Lakewood finished up in second place behind powerful Cleveland East Tech in the state meet.

Ross has only an exhibition with the freshman swimming team at Bowling Green State university to its credit so far. The team performed very creditably against the older fellows and Coach George Gruse's boys show promise of having a fine season.

LITTLE GIANTS IN FIRST DUAL MATCH OF YEAR

Sandusky Mermen Test Title Hopes Of Local Tankers

Swimming enters the sports spotlight tonight at 7:30 at the Ross high pool when the Little Giants compete in their first dual match of the season against ancient rival Sandusky.

High hopes are held for the Ross tankers and Sandusky with a number of veterans back from last season should provide a good stern test for Coach George Gruse's boys. Sandusky already has one meet to its credit, having met Lakewood at home last week.

It was Lakewood that beat out Ross for second place in the state swimming meet in Columbus last season. And Sandusky was barely edged out by the Lakewood tankmen, 39 to 36.

Lineups Listed

Coach Gruse expects to field the following probable lineup in the meet. Bud Ward and Don Smith will compete in the 50-yard free style. Roger Gerwin and Louis Appell will go in the 100-yard breast stroke.

Jerry Hunt and Jim Sherer will be the competitors in the 200-yard free style. Larry Price and Dick Longanbach will handle the 100-yard back stroke.

Bill Kirsch and Ronnie Whisler will handle the 100-yard free style while Dick Frampton and Ralph Engle will take care of the 150-yard individual medley race.

John Schwartz will do the diving for Ross. Larry Price, Roger Gerwin and Don Smith are slated to make up the 150-yard medley relay team. And Bud Nord, Don Nafulin, Jim Sherer and Bill Kirsch are to comprise the 200-yard free style relay team.

Power Shown

The only action seen to date by the Ross squad was in an exhibition match with the Bowling Green university freshman team. The local tankers took two firsts out of nine events against the older boys.

Larry Price took first in the 100-yard back stroke while the medley relay team of Price, Engle and Smith also captured first honors at Bowling Green.

LITTLE GIANTS LOOK STRONG IN FIRST MEET

Eight Races Fall To Little Giants Of Possible Nine

Ross high's swimming team scored a 49 to 26 victory over Sandusky here last night sweeping eight firsts out of nine events on the program.

Bud Nord started the Ross swimmers off on the right foot by taking the initial event, the 50 yard free style and then aided the club more by pacing the 200 yard relay team to victory. Don Naftulin, Jim Sherer and Bill Kirsch made up the remainder of the relay winners.

Jerry Hunt took first for Ross in the 200 yard free style, Larry Price captured a first in the 100 yard backstroke. Kirsch took first honors in the 100 yard free style while Dick Frampton was first in the 150 yard individual medley relay.

New Type Race

The 150 yard individual medley race, incidentally, was something new for Ross swimmers. In this event the competitor went six laps doing the free style, breast stroke and back stroke two laps each. Since it was the first race of its kind here Frampton's time of 1:59.2 goes down as the school record.

John Schwartz of Ross bucked two Sandusky entrants in the diving but still came out on top scoring 159.1 points to 141.4 and 129.2 for Lauber and Drake of Sandusky respectively.

Ross also took first honors in the 150 yard medley race with Larry Price, Roger Gerwin and Don Smith making up the team.

The closest race of the night was the 100 yard breast stroke which was the one event won by Sandusky. All four contestants came in right at each other's necks with Voight of Sandusky winning and Appell of Ross taking second.

Added Event

As an added event eighth and ninth grade teams from Ross and Sandusky competed in a special 150 yard medley relay event. Sandusky was first with the Ross ninth grade team of Price, Cross, and Burkett, second, and the Ross eighth grade team composed of Swartz, Sheldon, and Rose, taking third. This event did not count in the scoring.

As an incidental note it might be added that while Ross, third in the state meet last year, took Sandusky by 23 points last night, Lakewood high, No. 2 team in the state a year ago, could beat Sandusky by only three points in a meet at Sandusky last week.

It looks to have been a most auspicious start for Coach George Gruse's tankers.

In the first meet of the year here the Little Giants downed Sandusky 49 to 26 taking first in eight out of nine events. Just a few days later Sandusky dumped the DeVilbiss mermen by a 44 to 31 decision. The Toledo team could capture only four firsts in the meet.

The score was 50 to 24, and one additional point in the Little Giants' favor is that the event was staged in the DeVilbiss pond.

BEEGEE STAR SPEEDS 100 IN 56 SECS.

Relay Record Tied By Fremonters; Shearer Is Ace

Ross high swimmers, doing quite well this year in their own class, moved into faster-than-high-school company Thursday evening to help provide an interesting exhibition match with the Bowling Green State university freshmen supplying the opposition.

That the BeeGee boys would win most of the events was a foregone conclusion, but the Little Giants gave a good account of themselves, winning two events and coming close in several others, swimming in their own tank.

The team's speedy backstrokers, Larry Price and Chuck Miller, finished 1-2 in that event over Eric Weismann and Harry Seitz in one minute five and two-tenths seconds, and the team also copped the 150-yard medley relay, Price, Roger Gerwin and Darrel Smith doing the event in one minute, 23.5 seconds to touch the finish ahead of Carl Hobart, Ed Rauh and Jim Caldwell, the latter of Sandusky.

Old Mark Tied
Although the Little Giants didn't win the 200-yard relay, thanks to the performance of Harry Shearer, ex-Canton McKinley all-American swimmer, the team in losing tied the school record of one minute, 43.2 seconds. Bowling Green's winning time was one minute, 42.2 seconds. On the Ross team were Bud Nord, Don Smith, Chuck Miller and Bill Kirsch. Swimming for Bowling Green were Eric Weismann, George Ensign, George Garrett and Shearer.

Shearer in copping the 100-yard free style event set a new unofficial poll mark of 56 seconds, knocking two-tenths second off the previous mark. However, since the match was an exhibition the mark will not go on the big board.

Jim Pence, son of Mr. and Mrs. Bob Pence of Fremont and due to become a varsity performer for BeeGee, took two first places, the 100-yard breast stroke in one minute, 13.1 seconds and the 75-yard individual medley in one minute, 52.5 seconds. He touched out teammates Jim Caldwell in the latter event for the first time this year.

Seventh, eighth and ninth graders competed, too, in an exhibition, the latter team comprised of Price, Franks, Bork and Lucas winning. On the eighth grade team were Sherer, Schwartz, Lucas and Sheldon and, on the seventh Eversole, Hasselbach, Wetzel and Frantz.

One of the highlights of the program was the diving of eighth grader Larry Hunt, who performed with John Schwartz of Ross and Harry Craft and Ed Ayers of BeeGee. The youngster scored 79.5 points and gave all indications that he is a comer.

Craft, former Cleveland Garfield Heights ace, won the diving event in a beautiful exhibition. He scored 149.9 points, Schwartz was second with 122.2, Ayers third with 97.1.

Goes To Varsity
Shearer, sprint star of the BeeGee team, joins the college varsity Saturday at the end of the first semester. He will compete against Konyon. Shearer already holds the 100 and 200 free style records at Bowling Green.

Coach George Gruse sends his boys to Sandusky next Thursday night and on Saturday, February 5, the team competes in the Bowling Green relays against six other schools, among them Canton McKinley and Cleveland East Tech, perennially rugged competition.

Football Coach Les Binkley served as started for last night's exhibition.

OWLS' COACH RESIGNS JOB

Ray Morrison Asks To Be Relieved Of Temple Post

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 28.—UP—Temple university today began the tedious job of screening candidates to succeed Head Football Coach Ray Morrison, famed originator of the gridiron's "Flying circus."

Morrison, who had compiled 32 victories, 38 losses and nine ties during nine years of coaching at Temple, walked into the office of Earl Yeomans, director of athletics, yesterday, and asked to be relieved of his coaching duties.

Yeomans said Morrison felt his resignation would be "of mutual interest to himself and to Temple."

John (Ox) Da Grossa, former head coach at Holy Cross, and currently assistant coach of the Owls, reportedly was one of the candidates under consideration to succeed Morrison.

Six schools will be competing, including our own Ross high crew, which Gruse will not admit is of state title caliber but which may be.

McKinley on Job

On the card at Bee Gee will be Canton McKinley with its Tom Whiteleather, Cleveland East Tech, Cleveland Heights, Toledo DeVilbiss and Sandusky. Right now Canton McKinley looks like the power house of all named here. The team has been going great guns and Whiteleather has been the fair-haired boy.

Squad Confident

That the Ross high boys are pretty confident is shown by the sign we are told greeted the coach last week when he entered the dressing room after the Bowling Green freshman exhibition and saw a sign which in effect said, "On to the state championship." We hear George tore it down in quite a hurry and proceeded to tell some of the boys just what stands between them and a state title. The McKinley team is one of the barriers. Ross will go to the wars again Thursday evening at Sandusky, taking on a team which the swimmers turned back earlier in the Croghan street tank. Sandusky has splendid recuperative powers, always has had and always will have, as was proven a couple of years ago when the Ross boys doubled the score on the lake front crew here and then saw Sandusky win the state title.

Starts at 2

The Bowling Green relays will get under way at 2 o'clock in the university's natatorium and admission price will be two bits. School authorities at Bee Gee are declaring the relays the "Biggest and Best High School Swim Meet in Ohio," and since the state titlist will probably be there—unless there is something very strong in the Cincinnati area—that monicker should be about right.

The George Gruse-coached Little Giants gave a good account of themselves to wind up only seven points behind the McKinley outfit. However, had the diving competition counted in the team scoring Ross could have narrowed the margin, John Schwartz performing better than any youth in the event.

The invitational is run as a definite team show, individual performance not counting except as it helps a team to do its scoring.

Ross was second in the 220 yard free style relay, third in the breast stroke relay, fifth in the individual 225-yard medley relay, third in the 400-yard free style relay and second in the 150-yard medley relay.

Canton copped firsts in the 200-yard free style, 200-yard breast stroke, 400-yard free style and 150-yard medley relay.

In the diving event, Schwartz's score of 165 was tops over Paulin of East Tech who counted 147. Other fancy divers were Lauber, Sandusky, 130.9; Drake, Sandusky, 130; Zegaraz, East Tech, 126.6; Mariano, Canton, 110, and Sodd, DeVilbiss, 104.

Three Records Set

McKinley swimmers set two marks and East Tech grabbed one. The latter team did the 225-yard medley event in 2:26.4 to establish a record, Canton took two seconds off the meet record with a 1:40.3 time in the 200-yard free style event, four competing, and McKinley also set a record of 1:22.09 in the 150-yard medley relay, knocking three seconds off the old mark.

Tom Whiteleather, Canton's great swimmer, was the star in setting both marks, his performance featuring the competition.

BACK STROKE, RELAY BRING NEW TIMES

**Score Is 54 To 21;
War Hero's 1939
Mark Shattered**

Two records were established Thursday evening by George Gruse's Ross high tank team in defeating Toledo DeVilbiss, 54 to 21.

First mark broken was in the 100-yard back stroke where Larry Price did the distance in one minute 3.9 seconds, shattering a record set for the Ross pool in 1939 by Harry Stickel, who died during World War II while on an air corps flight in the southwest Pacific. Stickel's time was one minute 4.6 seconds.

The second record to be established came in the final event of the evening when the Ross 200-yard relay team did the distance in one minute 42.7 seconds. On the team were Bud Nord, Chuck Miller, Jim Sherer and Don Smith.

The pool record was held by Canton McKinley, a 1.43 set in 1943 and the school mark was a 1.43:2 held by the Ross high team of 1941.

The crowd which filled the limited seated and standing space around the pool cheered the swimmers on to the fast times.

While the Ross team outmanned the DeVilbiss outfit, the work of Chan Nauts, son of the principal of DeVilbiss high, starred for his aggregation. He won the 200-yard free style in two minutes 16.2 seconds and also knocked off the 150-yard individual medley in one minute 57.8 seconds, overcoming a long Ross high lead. Nauts was trailing the Ross swimmers in the breast stroke and back stroke parts of the medley, but overtook Dick Frampton to touch him out in the last five feet of the race, coming from behind with a powerful free style sprint.

One Other To Losers

DeVilbiss took only one other first place, Dick Aubry copping the 100-yard free style in one minute one and one-tenth seconds.

Other firsts which went to Ross included Bud Nord in the 50-yard free style, Roger Gerwin in the 100-yard breast stroke, John Schwartz in the diving event and Ross in the 150-yard medley relay.

The Ross team faces no more competition this week, but goes on an overnight jaunt next week, meeting Wooster Thursday there and then going on to Canton on Friday to meet the powerful McKinley team.

The starter Thursday night was Harold Althoff and the judges Jim Martin, Earl Christy and Bob Thomas. Martin was state diving champion in 1941-42-43 and Christy in 1940.
