Jay Farrell was the medalist for the match, firing a 37. Teammates Troy Ritchie, Mark Walter and Jim Straight all shot lower rounds than Sandusky's tops golfer, Eric Scott (51).

Fremont schools will tee it up

Ross, St. Joe announce matchup as Streaks win Invitational

Fremont Ross and Fremont St. Joseph Central Catholic will play unusual golf opponents this week: each other.

Despite being located less than two miles apart — Ross on North Street and St. Joe on Croghan Street — the high schools rarely compete in athletic events. That will change Wednesday at the Fremont Country Club with a golf match set up by first-year Ross coaches Denny Brudzinski and Denny Ritchie and longtime St. Joe coach Charlie Baker.

"What's extra special is you have two fine sports programs within the same community that

can get together and enjoy the day," Baker said. "And the competition goes up a notch."

The announcement came Saturday at the Fremont Country Club, where both teams were competing in the eight-team Ross Invitational won by St. Joe.

But Wednesday will be a head-to-head match, last played in golf "about 10 years ago," Baker said. "We won that one, I remember that," said Baker, admitting he could not recall the exact year or players from that time. "But I remember we won."

The Little Giants and Crimson Streaks met about five years ago in volleyball, estimated Ross Athletic Director Art Bucci.

Since then, according to St. Joe AD Mike Gabel, the schools have scrimmaged in girls basketball.

"It's great that we can get together and compete against each other," Gabel said when he learned of the golf match.

The match was not originally on the schedule and a contract still has to be signed for it to be official. If no contract is signed, the match will be played as a scrimmage.

"But there's no such thing as a scrimmage between these schools," Baker said.

"It will be sort of a rivalry because I know a lot of those guys," Ross's Jay Farrell said.

On Saturday, four of "those

guys" outshot Ross by 25 strokes for 18 holes. In this season's nine-hole matches, St. Joe has shot an average four-man round of 160.4, compared to 165.7 for Ross.

Teams count the top four individual scores for the team total.

Saturday's 331 by the Crimson Streaks placed them in a tie with Genoa. On the 18th hole, Kevin Cooney sank a 30-yard chip to help force the 331-331 tie.

As a tiebreaker, the scores of the fifth-best finishers were tallied. Wally Walarzak (St. Joe) and Nathan Tabbert (Genoa) each had an 88, forcing a four-man playoff on hole No. 1.

"We would be very hard to handle throughout the whole state — in everything," Baker said.

St. Joe nips Ross by two shots in rare matchup of Fremont high

As far as the golfers from St. Joseph Central Catholic and Fremont Ross are concerned, a tee-off between the schools is a once-in-a-lifetime occurrence.

That meeting took place Wednesday.

And as far as the golfers from St. Joe and Ross are concerned, their scores from Wednesday should be a once-in-a-lifetime occurrence.

In their first match in 10 years, the Crimson Streaks took a 2-stroke victory, 167-169, seven strokes above their season average.

The happenings-to-hype score: bogey.

"I think the coaches thought it was more of a match than we did. I think we were just playing for fun," said Ross's Troy Ritchie, who led his team with a 41, aided by a pair of birdies.

Echoed St. Joe's Dustin Dewey: "I think the coaches were kind of putting a lot of pressure on the players to play good today because coach (Charlie) Baker used to be the coach for Ross and now he's against them so he wants to beat them."

With gusting breezes biting at the players' tee shots, Dewey, calling his performance

"absolutely terrible," medaled with a 40 out of the No. 4 slot.

For St. Joe, Ben Sorenson and Aaron Zimmerman shot 42s, and Nate Waleryszak had a 43.

Making up for the struggles of No. 1 man Mark Walter (46) and third seed Jay Farrell (45) were Jim Straight and Mack Cole, who had 42s, and Ian Steinart, who carded a 44.

"This seems pretty pathetic to me," Dewey said. "I thought there would be scores like 35s or 36s. I know I'm pretty upset at the score I got."

The Crimson Streaks won for the 12th time in 13 dual matches, prompting Baker to take his win

and run.

"Both these teams are much better golf teams than they played today," he said. "They were a little uptight, which was understandable under the circumstances the match was initiated."

"We take the 'W' any time we can get the 'W.'"

Frustration was the order of the day on the fifth, sixth and ninth holes.

A slick green on No. 5 kept puts rolling wildly. On a wide-open No. 6, it was anyone's guess where the wind would force drives.

And the ninth-hole dogleg left

players, well, scratching behind their ears.

"It was just weird out there today, one of the weirdest matches I've played in a long time," said Dewey.

Both teams' coaches indicated their desire to continue the rivalry. Wednesday's match especially benefited the Little Giants (7-4).

"I think it was a lot of fun, I'm glad they played," Ross coach Denny Brudzinski said. "Our team needs a little boost and I thought playing this kind of competition will help us in the Great Lakes League tournament and the sectionals coming up in the next two weeks."
