

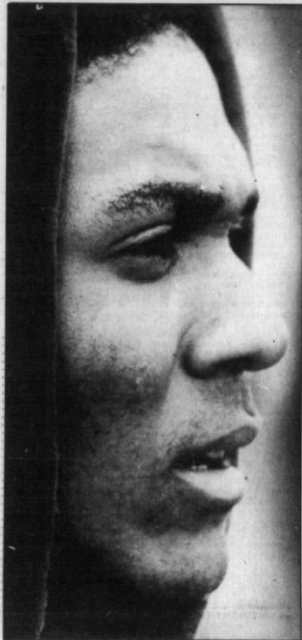
Ross athletes must be like the track...all-weather

Weightmen, sprinters, long, and mid-distance runners gathered on the track earlier this week, as they have been doing for the past

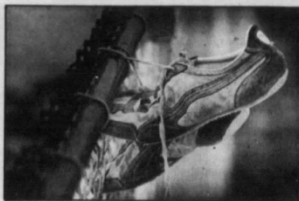

A PAIR of track shoes tied to the fence at the track signify the start of another season.

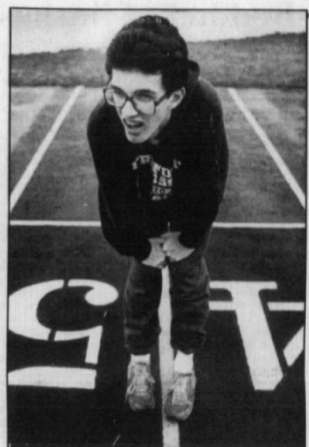


AFTER A hard run 220-yard-dash, these runners rest while waiting for the rest of their teammates

Ross banking on sprinters

Columbian 1st track opponent

The answer is obvious to people who have followed Fremont Ross High School track teams, especially those coached by Norm Bray, down through the years.

"Sprints..." Bray grinned as he responded to a question, "that is where you would have to say our strength is right now."

Bray's teams have always been reputed to have good sprinters and the team's success usually rises or falls on the whims of the sprint corps.

In a pair of preseason indoor meets, Bray points out that his sprinters have shown well. During a five-state meet in Columbus, Kevin Hively was 14th in the 400

meters in 53.53 seconds while Gene Simmons was 10th in the 60-meter dash in 6.6 seconds.

During the 59-team, Coaches Clinic Meet, also at Columbus, Hively was seventh in the 400, knocking more than a second off his time with a 52.2 clocking. Simmons ran a 6.45 to finish seventh in the 60 and the 1600-meter relay team of Trent Brown, Hively, Dave McDonald and Simmons finished 10th in 3:41.

Bray also got a preview of some hoped for strength in the distance events. Jack Konrad turned in a 4:51 in the 1600 meters in the first meet and knocked 10 seconds off that with a 4:41 while finishing

12th in the Coaches Clinic Meet. The 3200-meter relay was 13th in 8:46.

"By those showings," Bray theorized, "we have good indications that we might have a good track team."

Bray was also impressed by the showing of weight man Todd Beatty in the Coaches Clinic Meet. The junior heaved the shot 48-feet, 1½ inches to take sixth.

Sixty-one came out for track Bray said with 20 of that crew being freshmen.

The lettermen corps is made up of distancemen Konrad, Kevin Miller and Dave Slater, middle distance men Willie Norwood, a

senior, and junior Mike Mezinger, senior sprinters Simmons and Wade Parker, senior hurdler Huy Tran and junior weight men Beatty and Mike Bobay. Beatty is also a sprinter.

Bray is optimistic about a strong sophomore class, saying that "it's a good bunch of kids...they are good athletes."

Assisting Bray this season is former Ross distance runner John Elder, now a teacher at Ross. Chuck Ripple and Jim Grissweller will handle the junior high program.

The Little Giants will host Tiffin Columbian Tuesday in the season opener.

The Ross boys track team got a triple-victory performance from sophomore Kevin Hively, but it wasn't enough as the Little Giants dropped their track season opener 67-56 to Tiffin Columbian at the Ross track Tuesday.

In one other area boys track meet yesterday, Woodmore won a tri-meet over Hopewell-Loudon and Fostoria St. Wendelin.

At Ross, Hively won two sprinting events — the 200- and 400-meter dashes — and he tied Columbian's Tod Hyde for a win in the long jump. Hively's time in the 200 was 24.0 and in the 400 was 55.1. His winning distance in the long jump was 19-3.

Ross also won four other events — Todd Beatty in the shot put (45-1), Rick Leasock in the high jump (5-6), Gene Simmons in the 100-meter dash (11.7) and the 400-meter relay team of Trent Brown, Wade Parker, Beatty and Gene Simmons (45.4).

At Hopewell-Loudon, Jeff Haar, Jeff Katko and Dan Sandwisch each won two events, Bill Dougherty and Hal Gregory each won one, and three relay teams each came in first place to lead Woodmore (83½) to the tri-meet win over Hopewell (69½) and St. Wendelin (13).

Haar registered wins in the 200- (25.07) and 400-meter (56.6) dashes, Katko won the 1,600- (5:02.4) and 3,200-meter (11:13.7) runs, and Sandwisch won the 11-meter high hurdles (17.29) and 300-meter low hurdles (43.4).

The Wildcats' single winners, Dougherty and Gregory, won the discus (145-6) and pole vault (9-6), respectively.

Members of the victorious relay teams for Woodmore were: 3,200-meter (Haar, Jose Requena, Ted Wegert and Dan Gomez, 9:31); 400-meter (Randy Schneider, Gregory, Dougherty and Sandwisch, 48.99); and 1,600-meter (Sandwisch, Dougherty, Todd Emch and Dave Elder, 4:00).

Ross fifth at Whitmer

TOLEDO — Led by the individual efforts of Kevin Hively, Todd Beatty and Gene Simmons, the Ross boys track team registered a fifth-place finish out of seven Class AAA teams in the 16th Toledo Whitmer Relays here Saturday.

The host team Whitmer won the 'AAA' team title with 150 points, followed by Toledo Rogers 114, Tiffin Columbian 109, Toledo St. Francis 87, Ross 56, Toledo St. John 53 and Toledo Bowsher 48.

Hively's efforts included the second best long jump of the day, a second-place finish in the 400-meter dash with a new record for a Ross sophomore, and he also ran second leg on the Little Giants' fourth-place 400-meter relay team.

Hively's highlighted long jump was 18 feet, 10 inches, which led Ross to a first-place finish in that event. The Little Giants leaped a total of 54 feet, 5¾ inches. Jeff Gentry and Huy Tran were the other members of the team.

In the 400-meter dash, Hively registered his second-place finish and broke Tony Gant's school record for a sophomore by .9 of a second with a time of 51.2

seconds.

And in the 400-meter relay, the first-year speedster joined Beatty, Wade Parker and Simmons to run a 45.2 and come in fourth place.

Beatty's other top effort came in the shot put where he had the best toss of the day, 48 feet, 2 inches. That performance led the Little Giants to a second-place finish in the event with a composite total of 124 feet, 5 inches. Ross's other shot putters were Mike Bobay and Rocky Buehler.

Simmons, in addition to running anchor on the fourth-place 400-meter relay team, also anchored the fourth-place 800-meter relay team, which included Parker, Gentry and Dave McDonald. Simmons also came in third in the 100-meter dash in 10.9 seconds and fourth in the 200-meter dash in 23.4 seconds.

The top individual performance of the day was turned in by Wayne Boyd, just a sophomore on the Toledo Rogers team. Boyd set meet records in the 100 (10.2) and 200 (21.6) and also anchored Rogers' record-setting 400-meter relay team (43.0).

Victory is 'sweet' for Ross

"How sweet it is."

Those were the words of Ross boys track coach Norm Bray after his team avenged a 110-20 whipping by Marion Harding last season with a 71-61 victory over the Presidents Tuesday afternoon in Marion.

In other area boys track action yesterday, Woodmore drilled Eastwood 106-26, Lakota bombed Gibsonburg 103-29 and Bellevue dumped Clyde 97-35.

At Marion, the Little Giants and the Prexies split the 16 events, but Ross came up with four more runnerup finishes to gain the win.

Winners for Ross included Todd Beatty (47- $\frac{3}{4}$) in the shot put, Mike Bobay in the discus (115-6), Bill McCoy in the pole vault (10-6), Tim Tucker in the 110-meter high hurdles (17-5), Kevin Hively in the 400-meter dash (53.8), Dave Slater in the 800-meter run (2:11), Wade Parker in the 200-meter dash (24.6) and the 400-meter relay team (46.2).

At Woodmore, Bill Dougherty, Jeff Haar and Jeff Katko were double winners to lead Woodmore to the lopsided victory.

Dougherty won the shot put (40-2) and the discus (153-11), Haar took the high jump (5-11) and the 400-meter dash (55.5) and Katko captured the 1,600-meter run (5:10.6) and 3,200-meter run (10:58.2).

At Gibsonburg, Jim Schmidutz walked away with three victories to lead Lakota past the Golden Bears.

Schmidutz won the pole vault (11-6), the high hurdles (17.3) and the low hurdles (45.3).

Brent Hughes was a double winner for the Raiders, taking the 100- (12.2) and 220-yard (25.1) dashes, while Dale Rosenberger did the same for Gibsonburg, winning the 440-yard dash (55.5) and the two-mile run (10:39.9).

At Clyde, Scott Harrington won two events, but it wasn't enough to keep the Fliers from falling to the Redmen.

Harrington took the two short sprints — the 100- (12.2) and 200-meter (24.6) dashes.

At Marion, the Lady Little Giants of Ross registered their third-place finish with four individual victories, two from sprinter Pam Pitts.

Pitts raced to the 100- (12.8) and 220-yard (27.8) dash titles while Lisa Luman won the long jump (14-11¼) and Liman, Tina Michael, Kelly Wolfe and Denise Wilkins combined to win the mile relay (4:49).
