## Art Link Of St. Mary's Is Named On Class B Combine

Associated Press Nominates Two Fremont Stars to Guard Positions; Harry Bozarth of Bettsville, Rates Honorable Mention on Class B Squad

COLUMBUS, O., March 7—(AP)—Last November a total of 25,342 boys started down the long basketball trail leading to next week's Ohio High School Basketball Championship Tournament at the State Fairgrounds Coliseum.

Today the Associated Press presents its second annual All-Ohio honorary teams, made up of the outstanding individual stars of the pre-tournament season, and selected through cooperation of member paper sports editors and coaches.

The team is selected with the idea that most of the individual stars, because of poor support from

The Second Annual Associated Press All-Ohio high school cage selection placed two members of the Fremont Ross cage team, current standouts of the Class A team at Sandusky. ### All Seniors

Team records for the pre-tournament season played little part in the selections, the findings being made on individual ability alone.

The Class A first team is made exclusively of seniors, all six

footers with the exception of Don Bateman of Mt. Vernon, forward, who stands 5 feet 10 inches. All scoring threats, each topping the 300-point mark for the campaign.

Carl Martin of New Boston, Class B center a year ago, won the Class A berth this year in a nip-and-tuck scrap with Wilbur Coven of Elyria. Both are from Zanesville's sensational sophomore.

Squad B "Natural": Joe Cornelius, Middletown's sensational captain, won the forward berth opposite Bateman, while the first string guard jobs went to Paul Adams, Toledo, and Art Link, Sandusky's ace scorer and defensive star, and Bill Knisely of Xenia, who moved up from the third team in 1938.

The Class B squad is a "natural." Harold Peters, who shifted to Sandusky from Marion, where he was a great team of 1938, grabbed the center berth. He was the big reason the Clark county school won 21 straight games this winter.

The forwards are John Sheeler of Shawnee and Art Link of Sandusky St. Mary's, both of whom were dominant during the year. The berths went to William Hopkins of undefeated Summit Station and Louis Stahoven of Lore City.
