# Summer of hard work pays off for Ross boys

John Elder had a hunch the middle of the summer this Fremont Ross High School boys cross country team was going to go places.

"Back in June, the kids would come over to my house — they would be out running," Elder said. "Maybe two, other times three, would come over. One time it may be Dane Snyder and Doug Jibilian or Jeremiah Wagner and Clint Hill or any combination of that group...maybe Kurt Snyder, too.

"That was all without prompting. They all decided they really wanted to run cross country. I think that is where it began...the foundation."

The foundation was solid. Those five along with Jeremiah Smith and Jake Smith, set a lofty goal on the eve of the season.

"These kids were talking about the state meet," Elder said. "The GLL (Great Lakes League title) was not in their minds; they

wanted to go to the state meet."

The mid-summer visits and the lofty thinking have paid off. Saturday, at 12:35 p.m. at Scioto Downs in Columbus, Elder's team is one of 17 taking the starting gun.

That will mark the culmination of months of hard work.

It began with the summer jaunts and continued with preschool runs that began in the dark.

The majority of the team met Elder at the high school at 6:30 a.m. three or four times a week for a 30-35 minute run. After that, it was a shower and a visit to Elder's room for donuts while getting ready for school. After school, it was a meet or more running.

"Mainly the top six (Wagner, Jeremiah Smith, the Snyders, Jibilian and Hill) were in the morning runs," Elder said. "That is dedication and commitment that has paid off."

After settling for a third place in the GLL, Ross bounced back

the following week with a second-place finish in the district meet — the first step toward Columbus.

This past Saturday, the Little Giants reached their lofty goal with a third-place finish in the regional meet.

"One thing about this past week," Elder said, "and it is a key...everyone was healthy. They were not healthy at the GLL. But the past two weeks, they have been running great."

Wagner, Smith, the Snyders and Jibilian have broken the 17-minute mark and the sixth, Hill, has a best time of 17:14.

Dane Snyder and Jibilian are seniors, Wagner and Hill are juniors, Kurt Snyder and Jeremiah Smith sophomores and Jake Smith a freshman.

"I don't think anyone of them cares where they finish individually, but only as a team" Elder said. "They want to do what they can as a team."

It's worked so far.

## Little Giants surprising 2nd

**COLUMBUS** — Fremont Ross boys cross country coach John Elder expects to see a different attitude — an extra bounce in his team's step next season.

A performance like Saturday's at the state meet will do that to a team.

Ross, which took third in its region behind Cleveland St. Ignatius and Toledo St. John's, leapfrogged over St. John's to take second in the Division I race at Scioto Downs.

"We thought top five was a realistic chance," Elder said. "Beating St. John's was a goal; it seemed like the last three weeks, what they wanted to set out to do, they've done it. I'm just glad I was able to be around them this year."

Defending champ St. Ignatius, the state's top-ranked team all season, won with 76 points followed by Ross (142) and Beavercreek (151). St. John's was sixth with 179.

"Our team goal was to come in the top three and hopefully beat St. John's," Ross sophomore Jeremiah Smith said. "We had to step up. We had to have Dane (Snyder) and Doug (Jibilian) and all of them behind us step up, too."

"This is great. I never thought we'd be able to do it."

Jeremiah Wagner had the top finish for the Little Giants, taking 11th in 16 min-

utes, 14 seconds. Smith was 24th in 16:35 followed by Snyder (47th, 16:50), Jibilian (80th, 17:18), Kurt Snyder (85th, 17:24), Clint Hill (111th, 17:48) and Jake Smith (145th, 18:34).

Wagner's top-25 finish earned him All-Ohio honors.

"I was going for top 12," said Wagner, a junior. "I was going fast. We ran the course (Friday) night and I was feeling pretty good. There's some pretty tough hills, and I just kept taking those hills as hard as I could. This is the state meet, and that's all there is to it."

"I was trying to stay with Brad Mills of Oregon Clay. He finished two places ahead of me at regionals. A few people passed me at the end that I'd like to beat, but I'll take it."

Sam Bell of Findlay was the individual champion, in 15:45. Mills took eighth in 16:12.

"Dane (Snyder) had to race better today than he did last week," Elder said. "All seven of them ran great races. We wanted to get our top two kids in the top 15 or top 20. We wanted to go top five or even top three if we could."

How will Saturday's runner-up finish affect the Ross program?

"I hope it's going to bring a lot more people out," Elder said. "Now, the attitude can be, 'Hey, what are we scared of?' Other teams have to run with us.' Before, it was like, 'Boy, I wish we could run with them.'

# Toeppe is runner-up

COLUMBUS — Fremont Ross freshman Jami Toeppe said part of the reason for her second-place finish in the Division I girls race Saturday at the state cross country meet can be directly attributed to what she witnessed earlier in the day.

Toeppe, who finished in 18 minutes, 39 seconds to finish behind race winner Nicole LaSelle of Dayton Chaminade-Julienne, watched the Ross boys finish second in the Division I race.

"It kind of pumped me up," Toeppe said. "I wanted to be in the top three."

LaSelle finished well ahead of Toeppe, running the 3.1-mile Scioto Downs course in 18:12.

"I tried to stay with her," Toeppe said, "but she took off at about the mile mark. I just stayed back with the second-place girl."

Jon Burroughs' goal was to finish in the top 15 in the Division III boys race. Burroughs, a sophomore from Fremont St. Joseph Central Catholic, fell short of that goal by placing 37th in 17:08.

"I didn't feel real good," Burroughs said. "I just wasn't moving. I had to run a little better. I thought it (the course) would be a little easier than it was. I didn't have a good race."

"I wanted to try to stay with Steve (Smith). I thought he was way ahead."

Smith, a junior at Gibsonburg, took 46th in 17:16. Smith ran 16:31 (fifth) at the regional.

"We went out pretty fast and I wasn't used to that," Smith said.

"I was boxed out for the first mile. At the second mile mark, I just figured to finish as hard as I can."

Seneca East freshman Vincent Fries won the Division III event in 16:02.

"I've got next year," Smith said. "I have to train harder. It's a lot faster and there's more competition here. I can't wait until next year."

Old Fort's Brock Cleveland earned All-Ohio honors, given to the top 25 runners in each race. Cleveland, a junior, took 15th in 16:40.

In the Division III girls race, St. Joe junior Sarah Yeager earned All-Ohio honors by taking 17th in 20:19. She also was an academic All-Ohio honoree, an award given to state qualifiers

with a 3.5 grade-point average or higher.

Yeager's St. Joe teammate, junior Jamie Chapman, was 78th in 21:51.

In the Division II boys race, Clyde junior Ben Ingersoll crossed the finish line in 17:14, good enough for 47th place.

"I was expecting higher than that," Ingersoll said. "Usually I have a good idea where I want to be by the second mile. I start out slow, then I work my way up and go faster the second and third mile."

"I started picking up people who were falling off, and I wanted to be further up. I just pushed, but I couldn't (do that). I might have moved up on five kids."

Bellevue senior Mike Zieber was 72nd in 17:38.
