Net team opens Thursday

A veteran Ross High School tennis team kicks off the season by hosting Sandusky Perkins Thursday night at Rodger Young Park. The Little Giants net team has a nucleus of six letter winners returning for this season's squad.

Among the returnees is the Ohio High School State Class AAA singles champion, Jim Flower, a three year regular for coach Pete Michaels' team. Flower, a senior, was second in the state as a sophomore before winning all the marbles as a junior.

"Jim is great... there is no doubt about that," Michaels said, "but I have two other players who could be playing first singles on seven of the eight Buckeye Conference schools."

The eighth school is Ross and Flower is the top man in singles. Michaels, however, points toward Art Gilberg and Jack Hilty as being top notch number two and three singles players and are the two he feels could be the top singles players on most other teams.

"Both Hilty and Gilberg are sound fundamentally

in all phases of the game," the veteran coach says.

Characterizing his whole team of 19 (10 on the varsity and nine reserve team players), Michaels points to one of the key reasons that Ross has been so successful the past two years.

"They all love the game," he says.

Ross won the BC tennis crown in 1973 and 1974 and will be gunning for an unprecedented third crown this season. With Flower, the BC singles champ, are Gilberg and Hilty who teamed up to finish second in the doubles battle last season.

OSU picks Flower

Jim Flower, a senior at Ross High School will attend Ohio State University next fall. Flower, the Ohio High School State Class AAA 1974 singles tennis champion, signed a national letter-of-intent Friday to attend OSU.

Flower was given a full athletic scholarship, the only one offered for tennis by OSU coach John Daly. The Buckeye coach had been actively recruiting Flower since the Little Giant player was runnerup in the state singles as a sophomore.

Over 35 colleges ranging from Ohio State, Michigan, Iowa, Virginia, and Miami

of Ohio to tiny Swarthmore University sought Flower's services.

"I pretty much had my mind made up," Flower said when asked if he had given serious consideration to the other schools. "Ohio State has the facilities where I can play all year around and they have a good program right now."

St. John's in Fremont

The featured match of the duel meet will have Ross' state Class AAA single champ, Jim Flower, going against the player he beat in the state finals, Erick Iskersky.

OHIO CITY — Joe Albrechta stepped into the third singles spot in the Ross lineup and responded with a straight set win over Ohio City's Greg Waterman Saturday. Albrechta's win helped the Little Giants to sweep Warriors, 5-0, in the first round State Team Tournament match.

Albrechta, normally a member of Ross' first doubles team, took over the third singles slot when he defeated regular third singles player, Jack Hilty, in a challenge match earlier in the week. Netters in 5-0 rut, lose to Toledo foe

Ross is in a rut.

Especially the Little Giants tennis team when it comes to playing Toledo St. John's at Rodger Young Park. For the second time in as many years, St. John's handed Ross a 5-0 setback.

The loss knocked the Little Giants out of the first Ohio High School State Tennis Tournament.

The cold windy weather hampered play but Ross coach Pete Michaels refused to offer the presence of Jack Frost as an alibi.

"It was just as cold on both sides of the net," the veteran mentor said as he tried to thaw himself out. "St. John's played very, very good tennis — sure it was cold, extremely cold, but all of the St. John's boys played quite well."

The duel meet featured a matchup of the state's top two Class AAA singles players, Jim Flower of Ross and Erick Iskersky of St. John's. And just like last year, Iskersky, a junior, defeated Flower.

If Flower keeps in his rut, it will mean another state championship for him. After losing to Iskersky on Ross' home courts last season, Flower went on to defeat Iskersky three straight matches, the final win coming in the state championship match.

Monday night belonged to the St. John's stroker. Iskersky broke Flower's second service and held his own for a 3-1 breakaway in the first set. Iskersky broke Flower's service in the last game to take the first set, 6-3.

Flower broke Iskersky's service in the first game of the second set but lost his advantage when the St. John's junior broke right back to tie the set. Iskersky broke Flower's service again later in the set to win the set and the match, 6-4.

"Jim was having trouble placing his return shots off Erick's services," Michaels said as he reviewed Flower's game. "His volley shots were not sharp as they normally are and Iskersky was getting to the net because of that."

In other singles matches, Steve Solys, a rangy lefthander handed Art Gilberg of Ross his first loss of the season, 6-1, 6-2, and Brick Swirbul won the third singles match from Ross' Jack Hilty, 6-3, 7-6. Swirbul took the tiebreaker by a 5-4 margin.

WORTHINGTON — Bexley won the 13th Worthington Cup Saturday with Fremont Ross a close second. The Bexley team picked up 31 points to Ross' 28 in the eight-team tennis field.

Jim Flower, the Ohio High School Class AAA singles champ of the '74 season, won the singles titles while the Ross doubles team of Art Gilberg and Joe Albrechta finished second in the consolation bracket.

Ross made a big improvement over its finish of last year in the Cup. The Little Giants were humbled with a seventh place finish but reversed its play under sunny skies Saturday.

Flower won the singles crown over old nemesis, Erick Iskersky of Toledo St. John's. Iskersky handed Flower his only loss earlier this season in straight sets and pushed Flower to three before losing in the finals in the Cup.

With Flower taking his toll on Iskersky with a powerful serve, the Little Giants' state champ picked up 6-3 wins in the first and third sets. He dropped the middle set, 6-1.

At one stretch in the match, Flower won eight

straight service points and ended the match by firing an ace past Iskersky for the title.

"He just played beautifully," Ross coach Pete Michaels explained. "This is the best that he has shown this year."

Michaels revealed that Flower had suffered a slightly sprained ankle in the second round of play.

"I think the sprain caused him to put more effort on his services," Michaels pointed out.

Gilberg and Albrechta, playing as a team for the first time this season, ran up against an experienced Bexley doubles team in the first round and lost, 6-0 and 6-1.

The first round loss knocked the Ross team into the consolation round. Gilberg and Albrechta won the first consolation match but dropped the consolation finals to the team from St. John's.

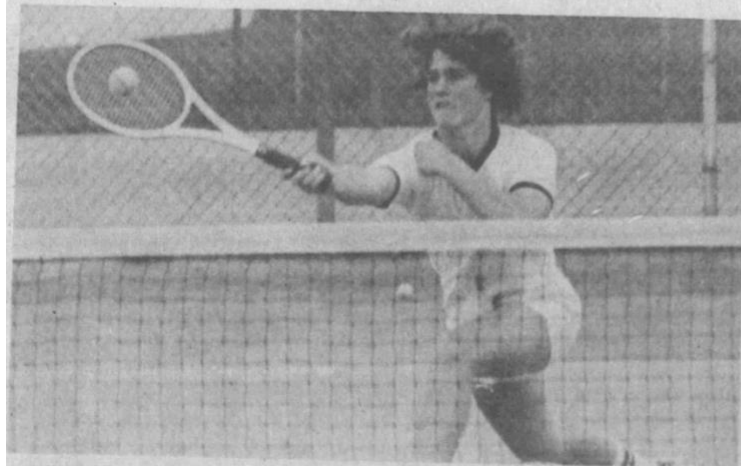

Elyria stroked its way to the Buckeye Conference Tennis Championship by rolling up 98 points in tournament play. The finals were held yesterday after rain had forced postponement of the championship matches Saturday.

Elyria claimed only one individual crown but had four singles players or doubles teams in the championship finals to win the title.

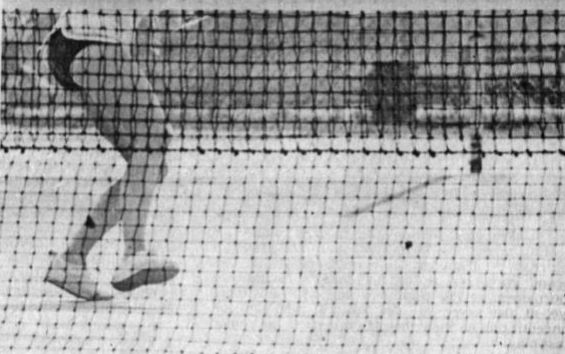

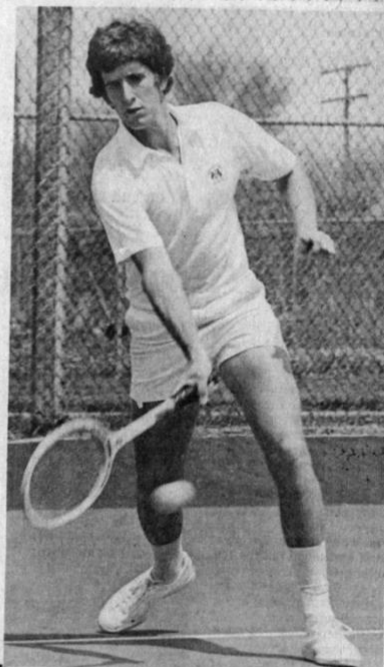

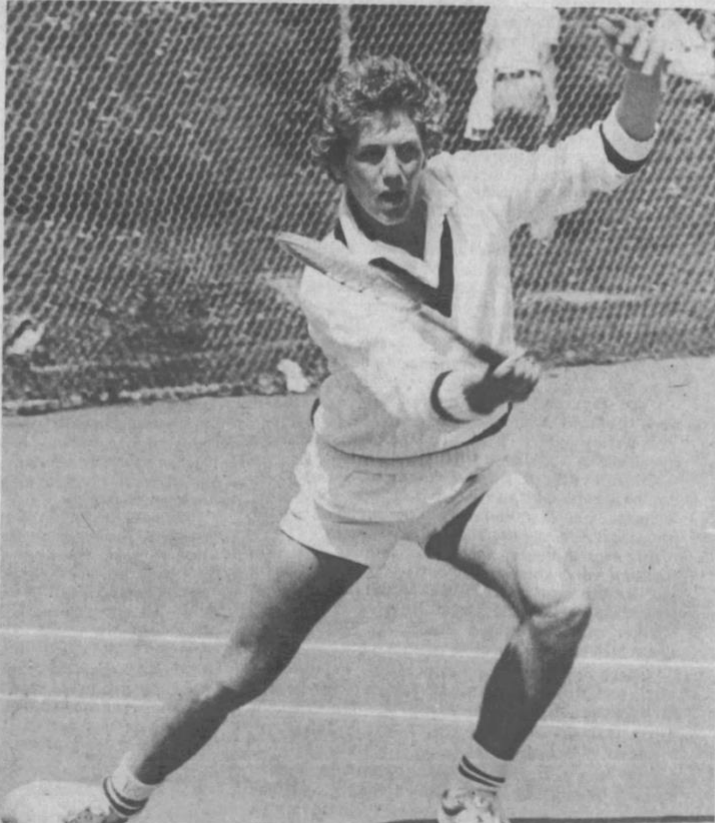
