Ross Golf Team Finishes Fourth; Findlay Sets Records In District

FINDALY — Fremont Ross golfers finished fourth as Findlay set a record pace in winning the Northwestern Ohio District golf tournament. The Findlay golfers, paced by Tom Norris' 68 had a total of 301 strokes.

This record district total over the Findlay country club course bettered by 11 that of second place Lima Shawnee. Ross golfers had a 335 for its fourth place finish.

The Findlay team total and Norris' sub - par round were district records. The old team record was a 303, shot three years ago by Ashland. Medalist Norris was four under par.

Terry Grose of McComb also had a sub par round of 70 to qualify along with Norris and

the Findlay team for the state tournament in Columbus.

Other Findlay golfers were Scott Hughes, 75; Mike Strathman, 76, and Tom Beegle, 82. All the Findlay golfers are juniors.

For Ross Bob Horner was low at 80, Bill Wingard had an 84; Jay Waggoner, 85, and Ken Hilty, 86.

The unbeaten champions have won 14 dual matches this season and the Buckeye Conference tournament, in addition to the district title.

The year that Ashland set the district record they went on to win the state championship.
