District Meet

Fremont Ross tracksters have a busy week-end in store when they engage in the district track meet at Sandusky.

With the Blue Streaks favored to win the meet, second place, according to pre-meet records, seems to be open to either Fremont or Mansfield.

The entrants for Fremont have not been named yet by Coach Harold (Whitey) Althoff.

Fremont will find the going much tougher at Sandusky than in the league meet here, as a large number of teams will be entered in Class A events.

Findlay will be one of the district entrants, with John Wickham, husky athlete, expected to repeat his victory in the discus scored here last Saturday.

ROSS ATHLETES CONSIGNED FOR SECOND PLACE

Sandusky Is Ranking First Place Choice In Meet

Preparations will be completed Friday afternoon for participation of Fremont Ross high's Little Giants in the district track and field meet in Sandusky on Saturday.

Rated high among the thin-clad aggregations expected in the district's big meet of the year, the Ross high squad has yet only an outside chance of defeating the favorite, Sandusky.

Strong for Second

Coach Harold (Whitey) Althoff said Friday morning that the regular team which has competed in dual meets all season would probably go into the district competition with no changes.

The members of the track squad, he reported, are in trim for the meet.

Fremont was second in the Buckeye league meet here last Saturday in which new league marks were made by Pete Fox in the high jump, and the medley relay by Leland Erchenbrecher, Ray Horn, Charles Wolfe and Sam Broshious. New marks were also set in the shot put by John Wickham of Findlay, and the 220-yard dash half-mile run and discus, by Sandusky athletes.

See Close Race

A close race is in prospect between Fremont and Mansfield, conceded second-place contenders.

Mansfield defeated Fremont in the only dual meet dropped by the Little Giants this year. The Red Streak victory, however, came in the first meet of the year, for which Fremont had but little preparation.

Many to Compete

Seven Class A and 25 Class B schools are entered in the district competition.

To date, 112 athletes are entered from Class A schools as follows: Fremont 22, Mansfield 25, Sandusky 30, Bellevue 12, Norwalk Community 6, and Tiffin Columbian 5.

Other schools, including Port Clinton, may send athletes, according to word from Sandusky.

Sandusky Is Easy Winner In District Track Meet

Sandusky, the favorite, easily ran away with first honors in the district Class A track meet at Sandusky Saturday, but Fremont Ross high trackmen made a creditable showing, being edged by a narrow margin from second place by Mansfield. The meet was staged during a rain.

The final scores were: Sandusky 91½ points; Mansfield 49; Fremont 43; Bellevue 29; Willard 18; Galion 15; Norwalk 6½, and Tiffin 2.

Fox Breaks Record

Pete Fox of Fremont, was an individual star in Class A competition, setting a new record of 15.1 in the 120-yard high hurdles. The old record was 15.8 set at Mansfield last year by Jim Whittaker of Sandusky.

Charles Brown of Sandusky, made a new mark in the 220-yard low hurdles, with a 24.4 second record.

Sandusky copped the lion's share of first honors.

Class B Winners

In the Class B competition Lakeside was winner with 52 points.

Other scores in the division were Genoa and New London, tied for second, 19; Castalia (Margareta) 18; New Washington 12; Holmes Liberty 11; Melmore and Monroeville tied, 10; Clyde 9; Republic 6; Old Fort, North Robinson, Milan and Bloomville tied, 3; Gibsonburg, Collins (Townsend) and Attica tied, 2; Norwalk St. Paul's and Amsden-Jackson, no points.
