# Moll Second In Buckeye

FINDLAY — Fremont Ross golfer Bill Moll lost the Buckeye Conference individual championship to Sandusky's Randy Manuella on the first hole of a sudden death playoff at Findlay Country Club Monday.

Sandusky took the team championship with 331 strokes. Findlay was second, one stroke behind the winners. Mansfield and Marion deadlocked for third with 342 totals. Ross (358) and

Elyria (370) rounded out the six team field.

Moll and Manuella toured the par 72 (36-36) course in 79.

On the first extra hole, Moll and Manuella both hit their drives down the center of the fairway.

Moll's second shot on the par 5, 562 yard hole, however, strayed off the fairway. Moll needed to play his third shot safe while Manuella hit his third to the center of the green 20 feet from the pin.

Moll's fourth shot landed on the green approximately 50 feet from the pin. Manuella needed three putts to finish with a six. Moll had three putts for a seven.

"I'm very satisfied with Bill," coach Charlie Baker said. "It was his best 18 holes of the year. He has been having trouble with his putting but he moved more ahead of the ball today.

"Bill putted much better than he has done at any other time. His short game was also fine. Regulation number of putts was 36 and I think Bill only used about 30 out there."

Moll, who's only a junior, had the day's best score for nine holes — a 37 on the first nine. In carding his 79, Manuella had a 40-39.

Other Ross competitors were Terry Daily (46-44-90) Kit Kindred (48-46-94) and Roger Hart (48-47-95).

Baker was surprised at the high scores of not only his golfers but the entire field.

"Those scores amaze me," Baker said. "It was an ideal day for golf. The course was in great condition. The rough was a little high but that shouldn't have mattered."

Fifteen golfers were in the 80s. Another six turned in 90s and one competitor shot an even 100.

# Lorain Drops Ross, 79-48

LORAIN — Fremont Ross captured only five first places as Lorain Senior tumbled the Little Giants in a track and field meet, 79-48, Monday.

Ross, which will travel to Sandusky Wednesday and participate in the Buckeye Conference meet at Mansfield Saturday, got firsts from Steve Tooman (pole vault), Al Widman (mile run), Earl Smith (440 yard dash), Chuck Celek (high jump) and the mile relay team.

Members of the mile relay unit

were Tooman, Bill Burkett, Len Ferguson and Earl Smith.

The Little Giants also had five second place finishers — Dale Shoemaker (long jump), Tom Liggins (100 yard dash), Tom Nahm (low hurdles), Widman (880 yard run) and Kirk Stout (two mile run).

Highlight of the meet was the performance of Lorain Senior's Rick Hans, who captured first place in four events — the high hurdles, long jump, low hurdles and 220 yard dash.

Lorain's victory snapped the Ross winning skein at four. The Little Giants had beaten Fostoria, Clyde, Findlay and Sandusky Perkins after losing to Marion in the season's opening meet.
