# Ross 'rusty' in opening meet loss

OTTAWA HILLS — The Fremont Ross boys golf team lost its season-opening meet Wednesday, falling 323-327 to Ottawa Hills.

"I thought they were kind of rusty," said Ross coach Dennis Brudzinski, who added his players struggled with their short games.

Matt Bauer led Ross with a 76, followed by Jay Farrell with 81, Ian Steinert and Mack Cole with 85, Mike Moxley with 88 and Doug Garvey with 91.

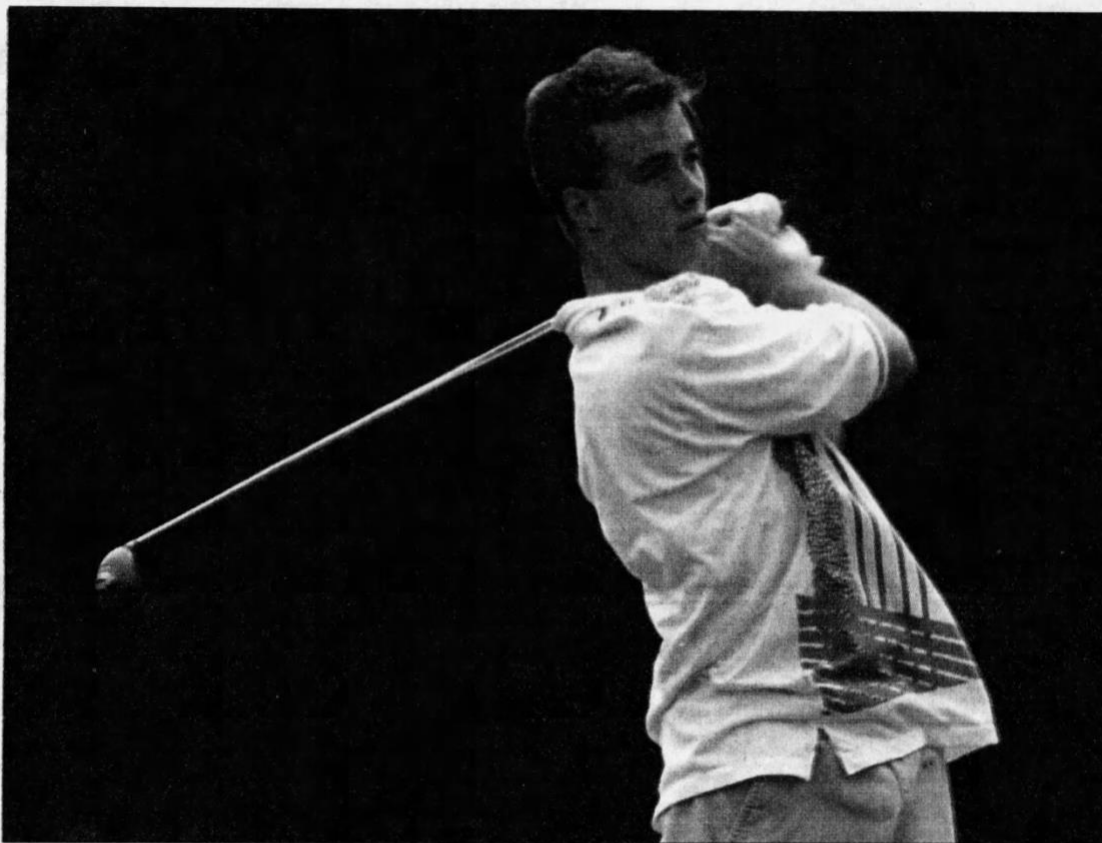

## Genoa wins wet, stormy title

Rain, lightning and thunder were not enough to stop the Fremont Invitational Monday at Fremont Country Club.

At least not permanently.

The Invitational, won by perennial powerhouse Genoa, was delayed several times by the elements, disrupting most golfers both on the course and off.

"I think more than anything they were getting frustrated with the rain delays," said St. Joseph Central Catholic coach Greg Kohler, whose Crimson Streaks finished eighth.

"We played eight holes, came in, went back out and played six holes, came back in, then played the final four or five holes.

"There was a lot of standing water on the fairways, a lot of kids had to take drops, and there was not a lot of firm ground to hit on."

Ross coach Dennis Ritchie, whose Little Giants finished second, 14 strokes behind Genoa's 321, said the interruptions aided some of his players.

"When they come in, if they're hot it

cools them off," Ritchie said. "But if you've had a bad hole, it more or less helps you out."

Ritchie pointed to Jay Farrell, who was plus-12 with six holes to go, and shot just one over par over the last six holes to finish at 86.

Kyle Peck led Ross with an 81, three strokes behind medalist Nathan Tabbert of Genoa.

"He's just a junior, played JV last year, and he's been low a couple times this year," Ritchie said. "He said he's put a lot of time into his game."

Matt Bauer and Doug Garvey both had an 84 for Ross.

Pete Lewton led St. Joe with an 82, while Mike Zimmerman shot an 88 to rank second for the Streaks.

"If they eliminate one or two bad holes, they're going to be right where I want them," Kohler said.

Tim Mayle and Roman Ruppert each had an 89 for St. Joe.
