Cross Country teams ready for league meets

Several league or conference cross country meets are scheduled for Saturday.

Fremont Ross will compete in the Great Lakes League Meet at Bedford High School in Temperance, Mich.

The junior varsity teams will run first — the girls at 9:30 a.m. and the boys 45 minutes later. The girls varsity race, with undefeated (in GLL dual meets) Ross the favorite, begins at 11:15 a.m. The boys race with Bedford, Ross and Findlay expected to be favored for the top spot, begins at 12:15 p.m.

CROSS COUNTRY

This weekend was a big one for high school cross country, with five area conferences or leagues settling championships.

Highlighting Saturday's events were runners from Fremont Ross, Clyde and Woodmore.

Jeremiah Wagner of Ross set a course record and lowered his own school record in the Great Lakes League Meet.

At the meet to settle things in the Sandusky Bay Conference, Ben Ingersoll and Jenni Staats of Clyde took individual honors.

Lindsey Hamilton of Woodmore, meanwhile, won her third consecutive girls Suburban Lakes League championship.

The Midland Athletic League Meet was also held.

Wagner lowers own Ross record at GLL

Little Giants upset in girls league race

TEMPERANCE, Mich. — Jeremiah Wagner of Fremont Ross took individual honors at the Great Lakes League Meet Saturday, but the Bedford Mules kicked their way to the meet as well as season boys and girls titles.

Wagner's winning time of 15 minutes, 51 seconds lowered his own Ross team record of 16:03 set last season and established a Bedford course record.

While Wagner shattered the records, Bedford placed five runners in the top 10 to finish with 27 points, comfortably ahead of the Little Giants' 69.

Napoleon was third with 75 and Findlay had 91. Whitmer was fifth with 94 followed by Sylvania Northview with 116 and Fostoria at 211. Oregon Clay did not have a full team and did not figure into the team scoring.

In the girls meet, Ross finished third after coming into the meet favored and undefeated in seven dual meets. Bedford won the meet with 45 points and nipped Northview and Ross for the season championship.

Northview was second with 49, a point ahead of Ross. Napoleon was fourth with 116, Whitmer fifth at 160 and Fostoria (164), Clay (171) and Findlay (188) rounded out the field.

The finish for the Ross boys was the team's best ever in the GLL.

"We got exactly what we wanted," Elder said. "I'm very pleased with our performance especially because I don't believe we have run our best race yet this season as a team."

Bedford's Jesse Elzinga was runner-up to Wagner in 15:59, with his teammates following in fourth, fifth, sixth and 10th places.

The Mules were undefeated in seven dual meets, earning two points for each win. Finishes in the league meet are on a 21, 18, 15, 12, 9, 6, 3, 0 basis. Bedford had 35 points while Ross, 5-2 in the dual season, had 28. Napoleon finished third with 23.

With six of their top seven runners from last year's GLL championship team, the Ross girls were bothered by pesky illnesses plus a case of "looking ahead."

"We had a couple of girls who were not feeling good," coach Cathy Mallia said Sunday after delving over the results. "I think we may not have put as much importance into the league meet but rather we may have been looking as the district and regional meets coming up."

Had any of the Ross runners finished one place higher, the Little Giants would have come in second and would have won the season title. The only way the Little Giants could have lost the overall title was to finish third behind Bedford and Northview in that order and that's what happened.

Both Bedford and Northview lost to Ross in the regular season.

Bedford had 31 points in the season title race with Northview at 30 and Ross at 29.

Jami Toeppe (19:38) was second to race winner Tasha Mindera (19:12) of Bedford. Mindera's teammates finished fifth, eighth, 11th and 20th.
