FREMONT HIGH WILL COMPETE IN BIG MEET

Locals Have Fairly Good Outfit
of Track and Field Stars
for Tiffin Joust

Tiffin, May 14.—Heidelberg university is making extensive preparations for the northwestern Ohio track meet which is to be held on Armstrong field Saturday, May 15. A squad of men have been working on the track so that it may be in fine shape for the contestants. Coach Sayger of Heidelberg is now assured that the meet will be a classic, as there are already five full teams entered with several schools which will not have their full quota. Those who are entering full teams are Sandusky, Fremont, Kenton, Norwalk and Mansfield.

The preliminaries for the hurdles and the dash events will be held in the morning beginning at 10 o'clock. The afternoon events are scheduled to begin at 1:30 o'clock.

A large 18-inch silver loving cup will be presented by Heidelberg university to the team winning the meet. For the three highest point men gold silver and bronze medals will be given. A number of tickets have been sent to the local high school for any fans wishing to accompany the team.

PURPLE AND WHITE SPRINGS GREAT SURPRISE AT TIFFIN TRACK MEETING

Finnish Third and Make Winners Hustle; Norwalk Wins Meet Finish Third and Make Winners Hustle; Norwalk Wins Meet With Sandusky Second—Dick, of Fremont, Stellar

Pulling the unexpected, the Fremont high squad was the big surprise at the track meet for the northwestern Ohio district, held at Tiffin Saturday afternoon, and finished in third place with a total of 31 points. The meet was won by Norwalk with a total of 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ points, Sandusky finishing in second place, two points behind the Huron county school.

Dick of Fremont, in the half-mile, proved the big surprise of the day, taking the lead at the starting gun and holding it throughout, finishing far ahead of the field in the remarkable time of 2:11.6.

Althoff finished tied for second place in the pole vault and was second in the high jump. McCarthy took third place in the shot put, which was won by Brown of Norwalk with a throw of 41 feet, 8 inches. Johnny Meincer and Angell of Norwalk, were tied for fifth in the pole vault, while Russell finished third in the 220 dash.

Russell took first place in the 440 dash, and Dick finished fifth in the same event. Wallace landed third in the 100 yard dash.

In addition to the three Little Big Seven schools entered, Mansfield, Kenton, Tiffin and the Junior Order school had teams entered. Mansfield took fourth place with 30 points, Kenton was next with 21, Tiffin had 5 and the Junior Order 3.

Naegle in winning the high hurdles unofficially broke the Little Big Seven record for the event, finishing in 16.1 seconds. The L. B. S. record for the event is 16.6 and is held by Krebs of Sandusky.
