Ross softball team will rely on defense

Little Giants are young but talented

Softball coach Christy Holland begins his 10th season at Ross with a fine blend of youth and experience.

The Little Giants, who opened their season with an 18-7 victory over Fostoria St. Wendelin Wednesday, have six returning letter winners, three newcomers, two players who played on the junior varsity team last season and two others who have varsity experience.

Seniors Linda Borys, Shannon Watts, Kim White and Tammy Dumbroff, junior Debbie Mc-Clure and sophomore Kim Borys are back from last year's squad, which finished the season 13-12.

Sophomore Shannel Moneghan and freshman Amy Brandt are promising newcomers out for softball for the first time and Rachael Ritter and Pam Wright, both juniors, have moved up from JV.

Senior Michelle Coppelman, junior Shelly Lamson and freshman Annette Myers round out the roster.

"My youth has the ability," said Holland. "The only thing they lack is the experience you gain from playing everyday."

White, who got the victory

against St. Wendelin, and Mc-Clure will do the bulk of the pitching for the Little Giants. Wright and Coppelman will split time behind the plate.

The infield is solid with Watts at third base, Dumbroff at second, Ritter at shortstop and Moneghan at first. Kim Borys, who filled in at second last season when Dumbroff was injured, is a capable infield backup.

Borys, though, will start in the outfield along with Linda Borys and Brandt.

"We've got more depth on the team than we have ever had at Ross," said Holland. "We're not really hurt when we substitute.

"Likewise, we can switch people in the infield and the outfield and not be hurt by it."

Despite Wednesday's 18-run outburst, including a nine-run fifth inning, Holland said the Little Giants will win with defense.

"We'll have to work a little harder against some of the better pitchers, but defense will be one of our strong points," he said. "We are pretty solid at all positions and that should help us in the close games."

The Little Giants return to action Monday at Lake.
