OWENS BREAKS TRACK RECORD

More Than 1,000 Ohio High School Boys in Athletic Carnival

COLUMBUS, May 20.—(INS)—Scholastic athletic records weaved and wobbled today in the face of startling performances here yesterday at the Ohio high school track, tennis, golf and baseball carnival that saw, among other things:

A new national scholastic record of 20.8 set in the 220-yard dash by Jesse Owens, Cleveland East Tech flash.

The 100-yard dash record of 9.6 seconds tied by the same Owens.

A new course record set by Ed Meister, 18, Shaker Heights youth, over the Arlington golf course.

In the face of these astounding feats, which left the keepers of the records gasping for belief, it appeared possible today that anything can yet happen—even more record wrecking at the hands of the sensational Jesse Owens, whose times in the 220 and 100-yard dashes are expected to be accepted on records for national scholastic competition.

Owens' time of 20.8 in the 220 dash yesterday was three-tenths better than the time for the present record holder, Don Bennett of Toledo. In the 100-yard dash, Owens raced to a tie with the 9.6 second record of Draper of Huntington Park, Cal.

Little could be told today of the possible outcome of the track meet in either Class A or B. Cleveland East Tech, holders of last year's Class A title, is relying on Owens to boost the team's point total high enough to carry the East Tech team to another victory.

But there's plenty of other class in the field, and four other schools in addition to East Tech, qualified three dash men for finals today. They are Lakewood, Cincinnati Hughes, Toledo Waite and Alliance.

SCHNEIDER SCORES FREMONT'S POINTS

Don Schneider, finishing fourth in the 440 dash, was Fremont high's only point winner at the state track and field finals in Columbus Saturday. Other Fremonters, Pettiford, Moore, Binkley, Miller, Peterson and Michaels, failed to connect with the score keeper.

Jesse Owens, of Cleveland, established records in the 100 yard dash and broad jump and his individual work allowed East Tech to take the meeting.

Watson, of Elmore tied for second place in the pole vault and Eoff, of Elmore, scored second place in the 440 dash.

Lakeside set a new record in the half mile relay as Henderlick, Eior, Krohe and Griesser ran it in 1:45.3. Lakeside was third in the mile relay.

Hettrick, Oak Harbor, was third in the half mile and second in the mile while Krohe, Lakeside, was second in the 220 yard dash and third in the century. Murray, Delta, was fourth in the 440 yard run. Diller, Bluffton, won the high jump at 5 feet 8 inches.

Prentice, Castalia, was second in the shot pput, Pettit, Lakewood, second in the javelin and Delta fifth in the mile relay.
