Harper, Hines big winners for Little Giants

OAK HARBOR — Fremont Ross's Carlea Harper won the 100 and 200, and was part of a first-place 800 relay Thursday.

Harper is contending with sore hamstrings that force her to apply heat before meets and ice for an hour after competition.

"The 100 was my first event," she said. "When I won that made me feel better about the other races. I just ignored it."

"I love to run so I'm going to do whatever it takes."

Oak Harbor's Tory Wood won the 1,600. She teamed with Allie Reynolds, Ashley Madison and Kaitlyn Harvey to take the 3,200 relay and Tiffany Elder, Madison and Allison Burkett to win the 1,600 relay as the Rockets' girls topped the Little Giants 85-52.

"I'm excited about how the team is doing," Madison said. "The coaches push us and it benefits us in the meets."

Justin Hines won both hurdle events and ran on two first-place relays as the Little Giants' boys beat Perkins (51) and Oak Harbor (23) with 101 points. Darien Spann, Jacob Berryman and Aaron Spencer rounded out the 800 relay while Wyatt Harvey, Devante Woods and Spencer comprised the rest of the 1,600 relay.

"It feels good getting four firsts," Hines said. "I ran my fastest time this year in the 300 hurdles (41.2). I'm still trying to get it down. It's not my best. I'm just trying to get back into it."

Wood established a personal best in the mile at 5 minutes, 46.6 seconds.

"We keep getting encouraged that we can go to state," Wood said of the 3,200 relay. "We're excited about that."

"None of us have much experience together (in the 1,600 relay). We all just want to go out there and win."

Harper said the 800 relay is her favorite event.

"(Thursday) was a beautiful day," she said. "(The 800 relay) went well. We could have done

better but I love that race.”

“It’s just so intense. I love running the 200 in general. I love to hear everybody cheering. That gets my adrenaline pumping. I love the curve in the 200.”

Harper is about 2 seconds off the school record (25) in the 200 and the 800 relay’s time at the Bowling Green Invitational was .4 seconds shy of that record.

“That’s the goal before the end of my sophomore year,” Harper said.

Sam Reynolds won the discus, Rachel Hegemier the long jump and Katie Lemon the 100 hurdles for the Rockets. Kelly Bryan, Kayla Diefenthaler, Morgan Turnow and Sam Scott took the 400 relay.

Scott won the high jump, Allie Reynolds the 800 and Harvey the 3,200.

Ellen Silva won the pole vault and 400, Alesha Overmyer the 300 hurdles, and Victoria Logan the shot put for Ross.

Spann won the long jump and 200, Kristopher Esparza the 1,600 and 3,200, and Spencer the 400. Harvey took the 800 and Woods the 100 while Luis Franco, Andy Leemaster, Esparza and Harvey won the 3,200 relay for the Little Giants.

“(Thursday) I did OK,” Spencer said. “I feel good about the 4X2. We messed up the handoffs and still finished first.

“We all did pretty good, but there’s still stuff all of us need to work on.”

Ross sprinter shares meet's top athlete award

CLYDE — It was a tight battle between Fremont Ross's Carlea Harper and Tiffin Columbian's Marissa Davis on Saturday at the Art Hendricks Track and Field Invitational.

Harper and Davis shared the girls trophy for Female Athlete of the Meet after virtually tying among four events.

Harper won the 100 and 200 dashes (in 12.5 and 27.0 seconds, respectively) and helped the Little Giants to a second-place effort in the 800 relay (1:51.2) and a fourth-place performance in the 400 relay (53.9).

"I think I did pretty well, especially since I'm running on two pulled hamstrings,"

Harper said. "I don't know how I'm overcoming the soreness. I have a lot of heart and desire, I guess. I love to run."

Davis anchored the Tornados' victories in the 400 and 800 relays (in 52.6 seconds and 1:48.8, respectively, added a second-place showing in the 200 dash (27.2) and ended up fourth in the 100 dash (12.9).

Harper, who ran the anchor leg of the 800 relay, was assisted by Ellen Silva, Donisha Walk and Jericha Martin. Davis, along with Tori Stephens, Anna Williams and Neka Maceo, led Columbian past Ross 1:48.8 to 1:51.2.

Victoria Logan captured the discus (115-feet, 110-inches) and shot put (38-2) titles for Ross.

Ashland, which won seven events and had four second-place finishes, topped Tiffin Columbian 129-126 1/2 in the team standings. The rest of the field included Upper Sandusky (73 1/2), Fremont Ross (59), Clyde (53), Toledo St. Ursula (37), Genoa (29) and Bellevue (20).

"We're getting better because we have a lot of freshmen who are starting to get it now," Harper said of the Little Giants progress thus far this season.

CLYDE

The Fliers, who were without several key athletes Saturday, turned in a pair of second-place showings.

Taylor Ebert ran second to Ashland's Kristen Donaldson (5:36.3 to 5:40.0) in the 1,600

run. Logan bested Clyde's Heidi Bentley (38-2 to 30-9) in the shot put.

Lindsay Smetzler, Ashley Alejandro, Taylor Guggisberg, Rachel Smetzler ran third in the 1,600 relay in 4:25.4. Mindy Gill (high jump, 4-8) and Maraha Estep (discus, 94-10) added third-place performances for Clyde.

BELLEVUE

Lady Red state qualifier Julia Walters placed second behind Tiffin Columbian's Stephanie Shockey in the pole vault. Both were able to clear 9-6.

Bellevue had no first-place efforts.

Little Giants cruise to win at Hendricks

CLYDE — Fremont Ross dominated the boys portion of the Art Hendricks Track and Field Invitational on Saturday.

The Little Giants won seven events and placed second in four others en route to a 140-91 victory against host Clyde. The rest of the field included Genoa (85 2/3 points), Toledo St. Francis DeSales (70), Tiffin Columbian (57), Bellevue (50), Ashland (22 1/3) and Upper Sandusky (15).

Justin Hines and Wyatt Harvey turned in a pair of championship performances for Ross.

Hines won both hurdle events, running 14.6 seconds in the 110 and 40.4 seconds in the 300. Harvey claimed an individual victory in the 800 run (2:06.4) and ran the anchor leg for the Little Giants' 3,200 relay team, which posted a win in 8:45.7.

Andy Leemaster,

Reuben Saldivar and Luis Franco teamed with Harvey during the 3,200 relay.

"We performed well and got a lot of wins," Hines said. "We still have a lot to achieve. I'd give us a 7 out of 10 for the level we're at right now. It's still early in the season, and we can still realize all of our potential."

The relays were strong for Ross, which placed second in the 400, 800 and 1,600.

Jacob Berryman, James Spencer, Devante Woods and Darien Spann fell to Tiffin Columbian (45.9 to 46.2) in the 400 relay. Clyde's Logan Garcia, Travis Lauer, Ryan Scharf, Kade Kramer held off Hines, Spann, Spencer and Terence Davis (1:31.9 to 1:34.4) in the 800 relay. The Fliers (Garcia, Kramer, Scharf, and Scott Koeing) claimed a 3:34.4 to 3:43.0 win against the Little Giants (Hines,

FREMONT — Fremont Ross middle distance runner Wyatt Harvey wants to be a military man.

On Wednesday, Harvey signed a letter of intent to attend New Mexico Military Institute this fall before entering the United States Coast Guard Academy in 2010.

"About two years ago, I was talking to my dad (Lee) and a lot of things we talked about in the military sounded right," Harvey said. "I like the organization and discipline of the military. I want to retire from it."

Harvey competes in the 400 dash and the 800 run for the Little Giants. He set personal records of 50.7 seconds in the 400 and 2:00.91 in the 800 during the Division I district meet at Tiffin in 2008.

"We have come to expect that we can always count on Wyatt," Ross track and field coach Cathy

Esposito said. "The boys team has been amazing this season, and Wyatt has been leading the way."

Harvey's parents, Lee and Teresa Harvey, attended the ceremony Wednesday at the Fremont Ross High School Hall of Fame Room.

New Mexico Military Institute, located in Roswell, N.M., serves as a preparatory school for the United States Coast Guard Academy. The Broncos are members of the National Junior College Athletic Association.

"I'm going to have to try harder and practice more often at the collegiate level," Harvey said. "It's going to take a lot more time and energy because it's a whole another level."

Harvey understands time management. He has maintained a 3.25 GPA while playing football and competing in track and field for four seasons. Harvey added wrestling to his repertoire as a junior.

"It takes a lot of time because you have to show up at practice every day, if you want reach the level that I have reached," Harvey said. "It makes it tough finding time to play sports and concentrate on school, but you have to find a balance."

On the football field, Harvey earned two varsity letters, was a second-team All-Greater Buckeye Conference as an outside linebacker and his graded landed him a spot on the All-GBC Academic Team.

In track and field, Harvey is attempting to earn his fourth varsity letter this spring. In 2008, he was the GBC runner-up in the 800 run and in the 3,200 relay, along with Justin Howell, Jeff Beier and Xavier Forney. Harvey was the district runner-up in the 800 before finishing 11th at the regional meet last season.
