Joseph, Starr Off To State

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—Cleveland John Marshall surrenders its Ohio high school wrestling championship without a struggle this weekend.

Fremont Ross is represented in the 103-pound and 112-pound classes by Curt Joseph and Ralph Starr.

Last year John Marshall amassed 32 points in taking the grappling crown — but failed to qualify an entry for the current contest. Bridgeport, fourth last year, also is not among the 77 schools sending athletes to the event, scheduled for the first time in St. John Arena on the Ohio State University campus.

Maple Heights, with seven entrants, will try to better its third place finish of 1961. Euclid, runner-up last year, qualified six. Others with six entrants are Martins Ferry, Elyria and Dayton Stebbins. Five qualifiers will represent Bowling Green, Toledo St. Francis, Steubenville and Columbus Franklin Heights.
