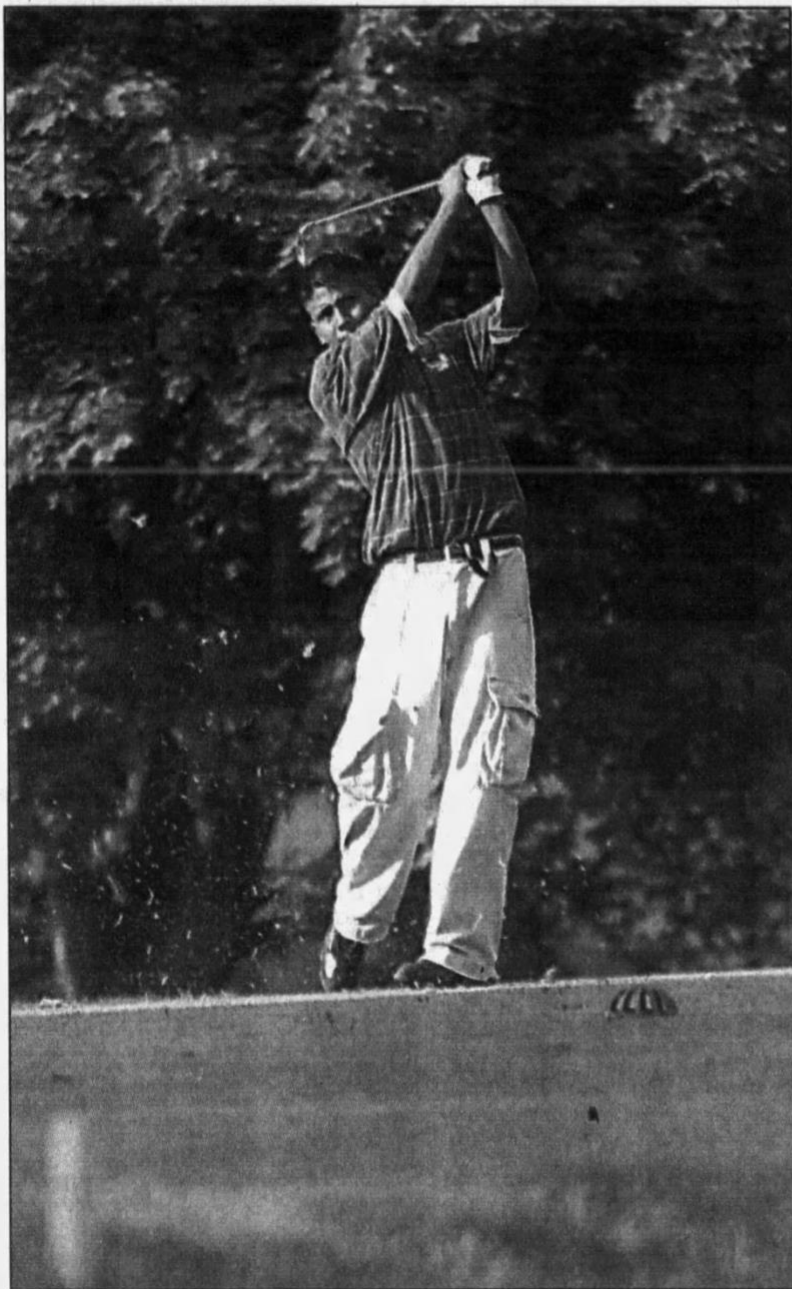

TIFFIN — The Ross boys and girls cross country teams started the season with fourth-place finishes in a five-team meet at Hedges Boyer Park.

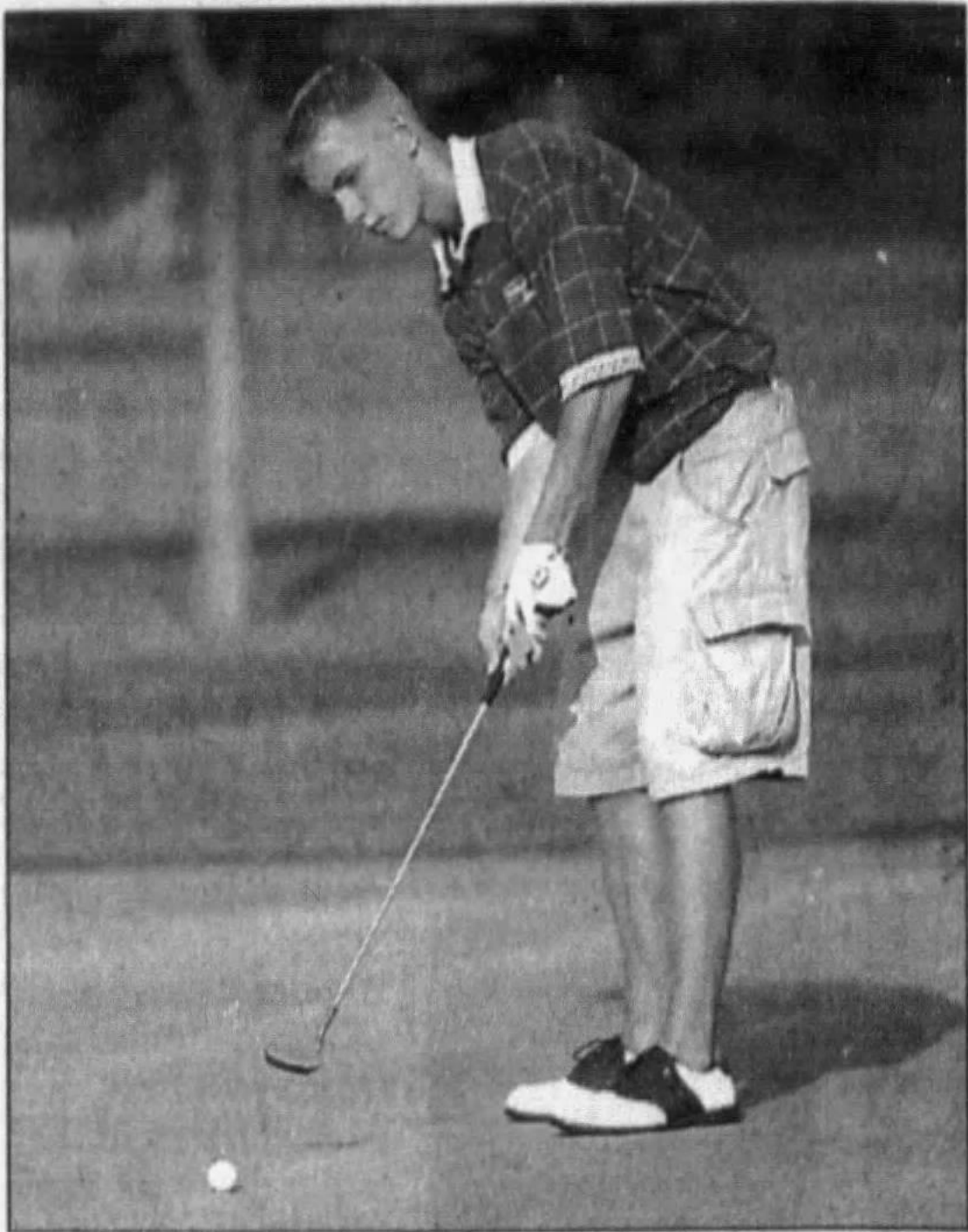
