## Fremont Golf Team Is Set

"Everyone is telling me I have the best golf team ever," Ross high golf Coach Dick Sherman laments, "but I don't know that for sure, since we haven't been able to get outside."

Sherman is in the middle of the muddle facing all the spring sports coaches. The weather, until Monday, hasn't cooperated and workouts have been confined to the indoors, hardly the place for golf.

But the first-year linkmaster knows he has talent. With 23 boys out, about 19 are just hoping for a chance to play next year. This year's club is pretty well set with four lettermen back from last spring.

Jay Waggoner, Bob Horner and Ken Hilty Jr. are the three senior veterans and junior Bill Wingard is the other returnee. All four are considered to be among the best linksmen their age around.

Sherman says they will shoot in the high 70's and low 80's and the team is looking forward to leaving its mark on a few courses.

He expects to keep about three other juniors and four sophomores with which to build toward next year's squad. Sherman took over for former golf Coach Jim Gruden, now the head football coach at Galion.

The team is supposed to get its first test Thursday at Sandusky but Sherman said that match is still up in the air because of weather and turf conditions.

## Sandusky Blanks Fremont Golfers

SANDUSKY — Fremont Ross and Sandusky got in nine holes despite a cold, misty rain Thursday to open the high school golf season but the Little Giants would have preferred to stay home. The Blue Streaks blistered the Mills Creek Golf Course to hand Ross a 10-0 drubbing.

Coach Dick Sherman said his linksmen didn't play bad golf despite the lopsided result but the putting was off. He added that Thursday was the first time the Little Giants had a chance to putt this spring.

Sandusky's golfers were well ahead of the Fremont swingers with four Streaks winning easily and the fifth, Bob Beamer, downing Jan Larson, 44-45.

John Gerber was medalist with a 38 in beating Ken Hilty Jr. who carded a 43. Dave Schweinfurth had 39 to easily whip Bob Horner's 53, which included a 10 on the ninth hole. Bill Wingard's 47 wasn't enough to halt Rick Starks, who also had a 39, and Mike Holmes followed the lead of the others with his 39 beating Jay Waggoner, who finished with a 45. Par for the course is 36.

Ross' next outing is scheduled for Monday at Fremont Country Club against Tiffin Columbian.

## Ross Golfers Notch 1st Win

Fremont Ross' golf team took advantage of their home course Monday afternoon to subdue Tiffin Columbian, 8-2, at Fremont Country Club.

Coach Dick Sherman's linksters earned their first win of the season after an opening loss to Sandusky last week. The golfers take on Findlay at home Wednesday and travel to Green Hills Golf Club for a match with Clyde Thursday.

Jay Waggoner took medalist honors, finishing with a three over par 39 to defeat Terry Parkins, who had a 51. Waggoner posted his low total despite taking a four over par seven on the fourth hole.

Bill Wingard and Jan Larson both fired 41's despite the blustery winds which made driving difficult. Wingard downed Dennis Riley, who had a 47, and Larson beat Bob Williams' 46.

Bob Horner notched the other Fremont points, edging Dave Moffet, 46-47. Columbian's only points were picked up by Ted Hiser who shot a 44 to defeat Ken Hilty Jr., whose 50 was high for Ross.

## FRHS Golfers Bow To Trojans

Fremont Ross' Jay Waggoner birdied the par five first hole at Fremont Country Club Wednesday but lost the hole. That was what the Giant linksmen were up against in bowing to Findlay's defending district champions, 10-6.

Waggoner's foe, Tom Norris, dropped in an eight foot putt after reaching the green in two to score an eagle on the first hole. Norris went on to shoot one-over-par 37 on the front nine and closed with an even par 36 on the back nine to post medalist honors with a 93 for the Trojans. Waggoner finished with 43-42—85.

Bill Wingard picked up one point in beating Mike Strathman on the back nine, 39 to 43 but Strathman had a par 36 over the first nine holes to post a 79 total for 18 holes. Wingard carded an 80.

Ken Hilty and Scott Hughes both picked up two points in tying with identical 43-43 - 85's and Jan Larson was tied by Tom Beegel, each firing 87's. Larson had 44-43 and Beegel 43-44.

Ross, now 1-2 for the season, takes on Clyde today at Green Hills Golf Course.

Eight of the ten golfers from the two teams broke 80 on the Bowling Green course. Only Ross golfer to win his match was Bill Wingard who took two and one-half points by firing a 76 against Ken Marini, who matched his 76. Bob Horner was the Ross medalist with a 75, but dropped two and one-half points to Sid Rodeheffer. Rodeheffer tied team mate Buck Vivian for medalist honors at 72.

Vivian fired his 72 the hard way with a first round 31, five under par, and a second round 41.
