## Cross country roundup

# Sandusky wins 2nd BC title

ELYRIA—Sandusky ran to its second consecutive Buckeye Conference cross country championship here Tuesday afternoon.

The Blue Streaks, coached by Pat Logue, were charged with 35 points, 10 fewer than runnerup Findlay. Third went to Marion Harding at 89 while host Elyria also had 89 but was placed fourth because Harding's sixth man placed higher than Elyria's sixth runner.

Admiral King was fifth with Fremont Ross sixth and Lorain Senior seventh.

Curt Rogers of Sandusky was the individual winner, finishing the 3.1 miles in 16 minutes and 30 seconds. Chris Villanueva of Findlay was second, six seconds off Rogers' pace. Ned Ayish of Elyria was third in 16:55 with David Skillman of Sandusky fourth and Jeff Smith of Findlay taking fifth.

Ross's first runner was John Snodgrass in 25th. Dave Slater was 27th and Ryan Smith and Mike Mezinger were 28th and 29th, respectively, for Coach Norm Bray's team.

In other boys cross country action Tuesday, Gibsonburg toppled St. Joe 20-41, Clyde beat Margaretta 20-35, Port Clinton topped Woodmore 25-30 and Old Fort (39) won a quadrangular with Oak Harbor (42), Eastwood (71) and Elmwood (78).

In one girls triangular meet, Oak Harbor (26) outpointed Old Fort (34) and Elmwood (60).

At East Side Park, St. Joe's Joe Colon captured individual honors, but Gibsonburg runners Dale Rosenberger, Lewis Morelock, Todd Rosenberger, Rob Thornton and Darin

Schroeder took the next five places to pace the Bears to their 11th dual meet win without a loss.

Colon was clocked in 15:52 to beat runnerup Dale Rosenberger by 35 seconds.

At Green Hills, three familiar Clyde names — Brian Hoffmann, Sonny Workman and Tom Kochendoerfer — finished in three familiar spots —1-2-3 — to pace the Fliers past Margaretta.

Hoffman's winning time was 16:59, Workman's time was 17:09 and Kochendoerfer's was 18:01 as Clyde moved its record to 3-5.

At Port Clinton, the Redskins upped their record to 11-4 behind Pat Fahey's race-winning effort. Fahey's time was 17:02, good enough to beat out Woodmore's Jeff Katko at 17:09 and Ted Wegert at 17:36.

Woodmore slips to 3-9.

At Old Fort, Ray Dunlap's runnerup finish and Cal Cook's third-place finish led the host Stockaders to the quadrangular win over Oak Harbor, Eastwood and Elmwood.

Dunlap's time was 17:48 and Cook's was 17:50, both a few seconds slower than the winning time of 17:46 registered by Elmwood's Sung Ki Leemaster.

Top Oak Harbor runners were Jeff Dornbusch, who was fourth in 18:02, and Fred Artiga, who was fifth in 18:10.

In the girls meet at Old Fort, the Lady Rockets and the Lady Stockaders traded places as Amy Macko and Julie West led OH to the win.

Macko finished second in 21:17 and West came in third in 22:04. Race winner was Terri Slane of Old Fort in 21:14.
