Rockets ace big test in quest for unbeaten season

PORT CLINTON — Oak Harbor coach Andrea Sorg and her boys swimmers have a clearly stated goal to win every regular-season meet this season.

And the group anticipated Monday's competition would be its stiffest test.

If that's true, the water shouldn't be too choppy from here.

Sorg's boys narrowly topped Fremont Ross 90-85 and beat host Port Clinton 122-58.

"This was the meet we were most concerned about," Sorg said. "Last year, we were 10-1 and lost to (Sandusky) Perkins. Perkins lost a bunch of kids and we kept most of ours, so that's looking promising. This was definitely the meet to be concerned about. It was a hard swim meet on both sides."

Port Clinton coach Dan Diaz said he believed before the meet that the girls competition would come down to two events — the meet-closing 400-yard freestyle relay and the 100 breaststroke. And that's exactly what transpired as the Redskins won

each of those events and defeated the Little Giants 96-86 and Rockets 126-59.

"They showed a lot of character," Diaz said of his girls. "They knew we needed a second- and third-place finish in the final relay, and instead they gave me a first and third. They never gave up as a group. It was an exciting

meet to watch. We knew it would be close."

The Oak Harbor boys tied perennial power Napoleon for first at the NWOAC Relays Saturday. Sorg said the victory "came out of nowhere."

"To tie Napoleon is pretty impressive," Ross coach Phil Moran said. "Every coach was a little blown away by

Oak Harbor's performance." Sorg said senior Jared Diekman, who often gives teammates pre-race pep talks, and juniors Kyle Beck and Josh Young have started the season very strongly. Diekman won the 50 and 100 freestyle and Beck won the 100 backstroke Monday.

"Diekman just continues to be a standout," Sorg said. "Kyle's a junior and finished strong last year. He's duplicating some of those times and kicking it into a higher gear for us. Young was about our 10th-fastest in the 50 freestyle last year, and this year he's second. I've seen a lot of improvement, and I expect to see more."

Morgan Drusacky, who qualified for state last year, won the 100 breaststroke for Port Clinton. Fellow Redskin state qualifier Katie Frey finished behind Ross freshman Jacque Fate in the 50 and 100 freestyle.

"From the beginning of the season I think (Frey) has picked up where she left off at districts," Diaz said. "She and Morgan are right on track."

Ross's Jessica Ickes won the 200 freestyle and 100 butterfly, Megan Wasserman won the 200 individual medley, Lincoln Fahrbach won the 200 and 500 freestyles and Jake Ickes won the 200 IM.

Jessica Ickes and Fahrbach are freshmen.

"We have some kids without big-meet experience," Moran said. "We're going to be very competitive this year. We'll have a better end to the season. We always do. We swim to get as many out of sectionals and districts as we can."

Mickey Burket (100 butterfly), Brian

Thomas (diving), Liz Czerwinski (diving) and Jessie Savu (100 backstroke) won events for the Redskins.

Stephanie Greggila (500 freestyle) and Don Tabbert (100 breaststroke) took events for the Rockets.

The Little Giants missed out on possible points because they didn't have any diving competitors. Ross does not have access to a practice facility with diving boards this season.

"That's why we need a new facility," Moran said. "It's hard to give somebody 13 points. If we had diving, we win both (boys and girls). But that's OK. We have to live with no diving. The sooner we get a facility, the better."
