

Ross, Elder Battle In State Baseball Finals

Fremont Trips Barberton, Cincy Measures Euclid; Gallagher Tosses 3-Hitter

COLUMBUS — Another come-from-behind victory has landed Fremont Ross in the finals of the state Class AA baseball tournament.

Doug Gallagher, sensational Ross high lefthander, weathered an early Barberton assault and his mates came through with two runs in the fifth inning to provide the Little Giants a 2-1 triumph over the Magics on the Ohio State university Varsity diamond in Friday's semifinals.

The tall southpaw struck out 18 Barberton batters, getting seven on called third strikes as he fooled the enemy stickers with a darting curve ball.

The Walter's, Mark and Harry, produced two key singles in Ross high's fifth frame.

Cincinnati Elder, four times AA baseball champion, scored early, held off a late Euclid rally to win 4-3 on the adjacent field.

Ross and Elder square off at 2 p. m. today on the OSU Varsity diamond to decide the 1958 Class AA state baseball champion to succeed Reading, the 1957 titlist.

Fremont's record is 13-2 and Elder's 21-5.

Gallagher started suspiciously, setting down the first three Barberton hitters on strikes in the initial frame. He ran into trouble in the second, however, Barberton leading the bases with some out but failing to score.

Stop Barberton Bid
Hand hitting shortstop Bill Muckleroy, a .407 batsman, grounded to Ross third baseman Gary Bierly's left. Bierly fielded the ball cleanly but his throw sailed over first baseman John Level's head, Muckleroy reaching second on the error. Jerry Straba, Barberton catcher, looped a double just inside the right field line, Muckleroy going to third (held up to see if Ross right fielder Chuck Houshbell would make the catch). Gallagher then issued his only pass, Kenny Roman, Magics' third sacker occupying first to lead the bases. The Fremont speedballer then fanned the next two batters and Level reached low to grab Magics' pitcher John Howe's liner to end the inning.

Barberton scored its lone run in the third on two hits and a stolen base.

With one out, left fielder Lee Smith singled over Gallagher's head into center field. He stole second, Gallagher got the next hitter on strikes but Muckleroy's hand grounded over the first base bag west for a double, Smith scoring. That was all for Barberton.

Gallagher retired the next 15 Barberton batters in order. He fanned eight in a row, got Muckleroy on a foul pop to Ross third baseman Denny Stine (who took over at third in the third inning, Bierly moving to left in place of Frank Walby), and caught Straba's easy pop-up to the mound.

The final three Barberton batters in the seventh went down swinging as Gallagher blazed his way to victory.

Level Probable Ross Pitcher

COLUMBUS—Jubilant Lawrence Dore, Ross high baseball coach, was congratulating his ace lefty Doug Gallagher immediately after the speedballer and his Little Giant mates had halted Barberton 2-1 in the Class AA state baseball finals here Friday. Win put Fremont in the finals against Cincinnati Elder this afternoon.

"Who's pitching tomorrow?" reporters queried the veteran Fremont pitcher.

"It'll probably be Level," the beaming Dore said.

John Level, the "Big Moose," who pitched brilliantly in relief in Ross high's win over Reading last Saturday in the Regional final at Lima was the No. one

choice of Coach Dore for the Saturday clash with Elder.

However, Dore could fall back on righthander Gary Bierly or even Gallagher.

"I'll use 'em all if I have to," Dore asserted. (That would also include freshman lefty Dick Dunder, no record this far.)

Righthander Level, a rugged competitor, is 1-2 for the season. Bierly is 3-4 but was not effective in a short starting stint against Reading last week.

Gallagher topped his record to 14 with yesterday's superior performance. The postcard, again watched by several major league scouts, had a rocky start against Barberton but was brilliant from the third inning on. He didn't allow a base runner from the fourth through the final, seventh frame.

"How does the arm feel," this scribe asked Gallagher during and after Friday's contest. The answer was favorable in both cases. "I could throw tomorrow if needed" the tall lefty announced.

Gallagher was bothered all week with a sore finger on his pitching hand but kept it in perfect form most of the day Thursday. The finger didn't trouble him at all in the Barberton game, he declared.

"I had difficulty with my fast ball today," Doug said, "especially in the early innings. It just went up there straight with no hop on it. I relied mainly on a curve most of the game."

Ruhl, in this year's starting lineup for Elder, were members of the state championship team of 1954.

Coach Dore of Ross is resigning after the current season. Even if Ross loses today, the veteran pilot is leaving out in glory. In three previous years as head coach since the sport was actually put on a firm basis at Fremont Ross, Dore and the Little Giants had never advanced past the sectionals.

Gallagher has now hurled in nine games, won seven, lost none; pitched 56 1-3 innings, allowed 7 runs, 9 hits, struck out 112, walked 40 only 18.

THOSE FREMONT FANS
A splendid turnout of Fremont backers followed the Little Giants to Columbus yesterday. There were an estimated 150 students on hand and a total Fremont crowd of at least 200. They really yelled too. It was simply wonderful. Coach Dore was all smiles when he popped out of the Ross dugout to view the Fremont fan following. There'll probably be a lot more Fremonters in the audience today.

Pete Michaels, Ross high assistant coach, commenting on Mark Walter's solid smash for a single in the fifth inning to drive in the first Fremont run, said "Wasn't that a beautiful pop!" Pete exudes confidence on the bench and at the third base coaching slot.

Fred Taylor, OSU freshman baseball coach who is a top candidate for the vacant Varsity cap job at the Columbus school, is tournament manager.
