Ross Tank Squad Pressed Closely By Sandusky, But Manages Victory 56 To 53

Swimmers of Ross high school, handicapped by illness of Louis Appell and Bill Kirsch, two varsity performers, came through at Bowling Green State university's tank Monday night to retain their district title.

But there were a lot of anxious moments for Coach George Gruse and his boys.

Sandusky's squad, always a tough one in competition, pressed the Little Giants all the way, failing by only three points in an effort to overtake the local crew.

New Record Scored

The Ross high free style relay team chalked up a new district record of one minute 42.7 seconds, wiping out a previous mark of 1.43 set by another Ross high quintet in 1941.

On the team were Jim Sherer, Dick Burkett, Chuck Miller and Bud Nord.

Ross also took first in the diving, John Schwartz scoring 221.35 points against 210.55 for Bauer of Sandusky. Diminutive Larry Hunt came through with a fourth for Ross in the diving with 167 points.

Chuck Miller won his specialty, the back stroke, in one minute 7.7 seconds, while Bud Nord and Dellen of Waite raced to a tie for the 50 yard free style points in 25.2 seconds.

All three honors came to the quintet from Peoria, Ill., yesterday. First the invitation to participate in the big post-season extravaganza, then the top-rating, and just to show nothing succeeds like success, a 57-56 triumph over Tulsa university to clinch the M. V. C. title.

In second place was the Western Conference champion, Ohio State, and in third was Holy Cross, the sole remaining major unbeaten team in the country. Rounding out the first five were Kentucky, with a record of 22-4, fourth, and Duquesne, 22-1, fifth.
