

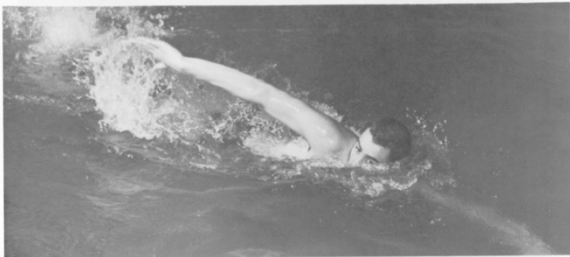

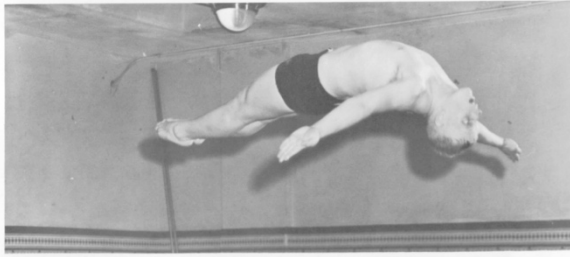

Past swimmers of Ross high will compete against the current Purple and White varsity an exhibition tonight in the Fremont Junior high pool.

Ross Nips Alumni 40-39 In Swimming Exhibition

One-point margin separated the Ross Varsity and the Alumni in a swimming exhibition Friday in the Junior high pool.

The varsity won 40-39 with junior Bob Cliburn leading the way for Coach Bill Faunce's Purple and White splashes.

Cliburn finished second to the terrific Gordon Tod (1959) of the alumni in the 100-freestyle race, Tod registering a torrid 55.8 and Cliburn 58.1. Cliburn's time was three seconds better than he has had this season.

Cliburn won the 50-free in 25.1 seconds, one-half second better than his best previous time.

Team co-captains for the 1960-61 season were announced. Seniors Dave Parker and Jim Kaufman will guide this season's swim team.

Alumni held a 39-33 lead late in the meet after Jack Talbot (1960) won the 200-individual medley in 2:36.8. But the foursome of junior Bruce Hathaway, junior Bill Knoke, senior Dave Parker and sophomore Jim Parker turned in a 2:01.7 to win the 200-medley relay and give the Varsity a 40-39 advantage. Alumni medley team, made up of Bob Corthell

(1954), Lynn Huffman (1960), Mike Reed (1960) and Dick Gwinup (1957), finished in 2:02.5.

Both teams were disqualified in the final event, the 200-free-style relay, due to infractions. Actually, the Varsity team of sophomore Tom Lloyd, sophomore Jim Hetrick, sophomore Bruce Landis and sophomore Steve Weller had a better time than the Alumni.

Reed of the Alumni won the 100-fly race in 1:14.8 with Jim Parker of the Varsity second in 1:16.7. Bob Agee of the Alumni won the 200-free in 2:35.6 with sophomore Neal Wensinger of the Varsity coming in in 2:39.9. Talbot, state competitor in the 100-backstroke, won for the Alumni in 1:04.9 with sophomore Jack Jailer of the Varsity finishing second in 1:09.6.

Dave Parker First

Dave Parker gave the Varsity a first in the 100-orthodox in 1:15.8. Gil Root, senior, was second in the diving to Dave Serwin (1960) of the Alumni. Jaisler's second place team to Talbot in the 200-individual was 2:46.4.

Alumni, organized by Ron Whisler (1950), were introduced before the meet and a brief rundown on what each is doing now was given.

Ross meets Findlay at 2:30 p.m. January 7 at Findlay, then is home for the first time in a meet with strong Lima Senior at 7 p.m. Tuesday, January 10.

Bradley Halts Cincy; Loss For Marquette Five

PEORIA, Ill. (AP) — At long last, Bradley, the country's No. 2 team, appears ready to shed its role as runner-up in the Missouri Valley Conference and take over championship matters.

For the last four seasons the Braves have finished second in the MVC—three times behind Cincinnati's Braves led by Oscar Robertson who has advanced to the pro league.

The Braves kayoed Cincinnati 72-53 Friday night in their conference opener and ran their string to 14 victories—eight of which have come this season. It was also Bradley's 42nd straight home triumph dating back to Jan. 20, 1958, when Portland came through with an upset.

Bolstered by such veterans as Chet Walker, Al Saunders, Ed Wodka, Lee Edwards and Mack Herndon, Bradley also has been graced by such sophomore standouts as Tim Robinson and Walt Gerard.

Ross high swimming team, loser to Findlay at Findlay Saturday 45-40, opens its home session Tuesday at 7 p.m. against Lima Senior high in the Junior high pool.

Coach Bill Faunce's Ross splashers won three individual races and one relay against Findlay.

Jim Parker had a good 1:15.2 time in winning the 100-fly and almost pulled the 160-medley relay out for Ross which would have given the Purple and White the meet. Ross 160-medley team, made up of Bruce Hathaway, Bill Knoke, Parker and Bruce Landis, finished in the time of 1:33. Findlay, with Kmisman, Ferman, Ludi and Bruman performing, won in 1:32.8.

Jim Kaufman was second in the diving event by less than a point. Siford of Findlay won with 173.0 points to Kaufman's 172.6. Third was Ross high's Gil Root.

Ross 160 - free medley team, composed of Tom Lloyd, Dave Parker, Steve Weller and Bob Cliburn, won in the time of 1:21.2.

Trailing 42-36 entering the final event, the 200-yard freestyle relay, Ross needed the seven points awarded the winner to cop the meet. And the foursome of Tom Lloyd, Bruce Landis, Steve Weller and Dave Parker came through to beat the Lima relay team and give Fremont a 43-42 decision.

Fremont 200-free foursome went the distance in 1:44.5. Dave Parker is a senior, the others sophomores.

Best individual marks for Ross were by junior Bob Cliburn, winner in 25.7 seconds of the 50-free-style; by Dave Parker, winner in 2:23.6 of the 200 - freestyle; and by sophomore Jack Jaisler, winner in 2:38.6 of the 200-individual.

Jim Kaufman won the diving event, 109.3 points, with Ross teammate Gil Root second, 93.6 points. Both are seniors.

Mike Carpenter of Lima won the 100-butterfly in 1:03.4 with Neal Wensinger, Ross, second. Jim Parker of Ross would have taken second but was disqualified. S. Wilt of Lima won the 100-backstroke in 1:03.6 with Jaisler second, 1:08.9, and Gene Smith, Ross, third, 1:10.9.

Bob Morris and Bill Knoke of Ross tied for third in the 100-orthodox. Trailing D. Wilt in the 100-free was Cliburn, 59.5, and Lloyd, 59.9.

Lima's 200-medley relay team (Thompson, Taylor, Wilt, Hirts) won in the time of 1:58.2 with Ross going in 2:05.6 (members Bruce Hathaway, Knoke, Kaufman, Jim Hetrick).
