Findlay wins 8th straight BC golf championship

ELYRIA — Findlay won its eighth consecutive Buckeye Conference Golf Tournament title Monday at Spring Valley Country Club.

Ross and Marion Harding tied for the runnerup spot, a distant 29 shots off the 322 posted by the Trojans.

Dave Miller of Ross, the medalist in the 1980 tournament, had to shake off the flu bug for the tourney but felt the effects and slipped to an 82, low for Ross but not good enough to defend his individual title.

Bill Lundeen, a Findlay sophomore, shot a four-over par 76 to take the medalist honors. Runnerup was teammate Cheryl Stacy at 78. It was the third straight year that Stacy finished as the runnerup. Another Trojan player, and another sophomore, Jim Wilkins had a 79. Then came Miller's score.

"Everyone of our players had a worse back nine than on the front," Ross Coach Dave Fleming said. "It was not a very tough course so I am kind of disappointed with the scores but I felt that second place was about as good as we could finish.

"I expected Findlay to win it but I thought we could take second outright."

Following Dave Miller's 82 was his brother Matt at 87. Tony Michael shot a 93 with Kurt Nitschke matching that tally. Brian Farr finished at 89.
