Little Giants ready to begin GLL title defense

Six district qualifiers return for Fremont

Last season, Fremont Ross was picked to win the Great Lakes League in wrestling, and the Little Giants didn't disappoint.

This season, the Little Giants are once again picked to win the GLL and from all appearances the Little Giants will do just that as they prepare to snare their second GLL crown in a row.

"At our recent league meeting, the other coaches thought that we should repeat as champions," Ross head coach Grover Dowell said. "I actually look for it to be a pretty even league this year. Napoleon will be a sleeper team because their coach said they had a good season last year and nobody knows much about them. Clay always has a good program and may surprise some people. Whitmer always does a nice job, and Sandusky only lost one kid from last year and should be stronger."

"I do agree that we should be at the top of the GLL, but you never know what will happen with injuries and everything else that can happen. You don't want to brag on your team, but this will probably be one of the strongest teams, if not the strongest team, I've ever had here. But the kids have to perform like they did last year and then take it up another step."

In addition to winning the GLL, Ross also won the Mackey Tournament and had a 7-4 dual meet record last season.

To repeat that success, Ross will have to replace good wrestlers in Zac Potridge, Tommy Wagner, Mike Shanahan and Jessie Wukie, all of whom graduated.

"Losing those guys means some big holes to fill in our lineup," Dowell said. "When those guys stepped on the mat, we were pretty confident that they were going to win most of the time for us. They were hard workers and experienced. They pretty much did everything that we told them. They are definitely going to be missed. They were also very good quality kids."

The reason Ross was picked to win the GLL is obvious with one

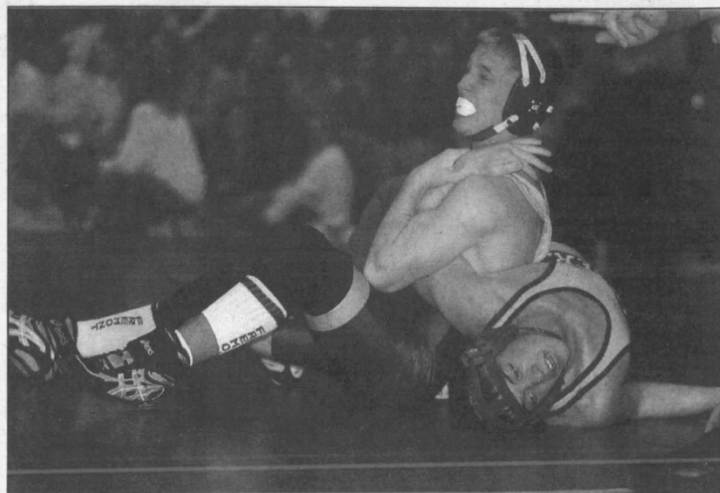

look at the lineup. The Little Giants return six district qualifiers — Jake Gutschalk, Austin Earle, Kyle Wensinger, Chris Kayser, Luke Swint and Jarrod Pena — and state placer Andrew Legg from last year's team. Also, Brock Davis transferred back to Ross from St. Joe, and Derek Earhart's family moved back to Fremont from California. There are 34 wrestlers on the roster.

"I'll tell you right now, when you can look down your lineup and see all of those district qualifiers it helps," Dowell said. "Those guys aren't just good, they've been working their butts off. These kids know what they've got going here and what they have to do."

"Getting Brock Davis back from St. Joe is also a big plus. Technique-wise, Brock is very strong. He's got a good attitude, and I'm looking forward to working with him as well as all the

kids this season. Derek Earhart family moved back from California, and he wrestled well for us in the past. Brandon Wolf has been stuck behind Andrew Legg and Tommy Wagner and now he's got a spot, so I'm eager to see what he can do."

"You love to see a kid come out and put in his time and then finally get a spot as a reward for all of his hard work. A lot of kids aren't willing to sit for a while to wait for a spot to open up."

Ross will have two wrestlers in all but two weight classes.

"I lucked out this year because where we might have had some roster spot trouble I had a good crew of freshmen come in to help fill them out," Dowell said. "Zach Brunner, Kyle Watts and Jaime Mendoza are freshmen who will jump between 103 and 112 until one of the older kids can

see if they can get down to 112 pounds."

Veterans don't only make for a good team but they make workouts go much more smoothly.

"With the veterans that we have on this team practices have been going really well," Dowell said. "At the end of the first week, I was tickled that we were already ahead of our schedule of where we want to be. We don't have to work so much on basics. These guys know what's expected at practice and what we have to do. They are really working hard on

their techniques to get better."

"I've been really impressed with my older kids, the juniors and seniors, and the leadership that they've shown. They get done what needs to be done and take on a guidance role with the younger kids."

Helping Dowell on the mats will be assistants Don Wensinger, Jamie Ross, Mike Mezinger, Andy Earle, Aaron Root, Steve Smith and Mike Schupennies, plus a host of former wrestlers.

"I've really been blessed with former high school wrestlers coming back to help out with the program," Dowell said.

TOLEDO — Brock Davis and Andrew Legg won their weight classes for the second week in a row, and Fremont Ross teammate Chris Kayser joined the fun Saturday at the Rogers Holiday Invitational.

Titles by Davis, Legg and Kayser carried the Little Giants to second place behind the host Rams at the 18-team tournament. Ross scored 162.5 points, 11 fewer than Rogers. Coventry was third with 160.5 points.

The Little Giants also got third places from Jake Gutschalk (140 pounds), Austin Earle (152) and Myles Porter (160).

Bellevue 43, Oak Harbor 18

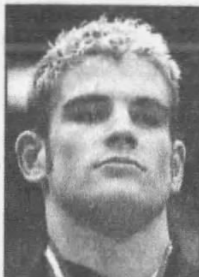

Giants win again

Host Ross boasts seven champions

As the 30th annual Mal Mackey Memorial Wrestling Tournament got under way Saturday, it became very obvious that Fremont Ross was going to win its 10th Mackey title in a row.

The big question that remained for Little Giants fans was by how much and how many champions would Ross end up with.

The answer to the first question was by plenty as the Little Giants rolled up a 233½-point team score, with second place going to Otsego (137 points), which edged out Northwood, which had 133 points. Sylvania was fourth with 101½ points, and Port Clinton was fifth with 65½ points in the eight-team tournament.

"I was real happy that almost every kid on the team was able to contribute towards the win today," Ross coach Grover Dowell said. "It was a really good team effort; There were some really tough kids here and for us to come out that far ahead meant that we really pulled it together."

"To have 11 kids in the finals

wrestling for first or second was outstanding. I was really happy with the way our kids wrestled the first two rounds. ... "We aren't home a lot so when you are and you come out winners it does a lot for the fans and the program."

The Little Giants ended up with seven individual champions out of 14 weight classes and four second-place finishers.

Ross was led by senior Chris Kayser, who won his fourth straight Mackey title at 215 pounds. In 30 years, only two other wrestlers have accomplished the feat. Kayser won previous titles at 160, 171 and 189.

"This just feels so great," Kayser said. "Only two other guys have ever been able to win four titles in 30 years. It's especially nice to do it in our own tournament. I was worried about the whole tournament in general coming into today. I knew that I was going for four titles and nerves started to settle in a little. Just look at our team, they just shocked me today. We had 11 kids going for first and second. That's unbelievable."

Zack Brunner got the day started right for Ross by winning the 103-pound title with a one minute, 12 second fall over Jeremy Henning of Northwood.

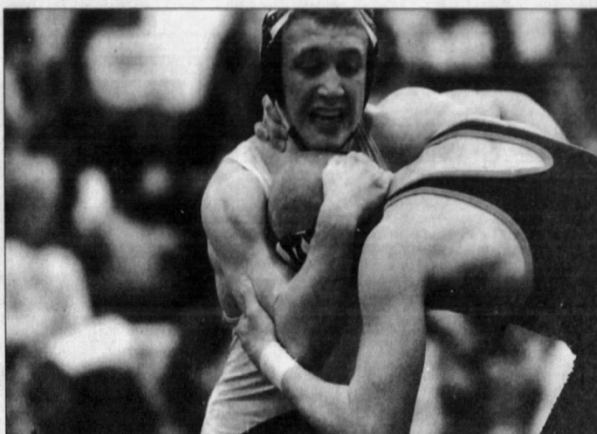
"It feels really good to win a Mackey title," Brunner said. "I had some hard matches. For the title, I was able to trip the kids legs into a headlock for a pin to win it."

Next up for the Little Giants was Sam Krueger, who recorded a 1:53 fall over Bobby Walker of Otsego at 119 pounds. Brock Davis collected Ross's third title with a 10-7 decision over Kevin Witucki of Port Clinton at 125 pounds.

"My day went fine until the last kid that I wrestled in the finals," Davis said. "I'm not used to kids hanging with me on takedowns. The last match came down to scrambling. But the more we scrambled, the better my chances of winning were."

Austin Earle got Ross back on track when he collected the 152-pound title with a 5:28 fall over Garrett Bays of Otsego. It was Earle's second title.

"I just had to wait for my time," Earle said. "I thought I

had it a couple of times but he had too much pressure in on me. But I kept waiting for it and finally there it was and I took it. I crossed faced him really hard and threw my hips in and he went straight to his back. Earlier I was a little groggy after he hit me in the head and I had a little trouble seeing for awhile, but I

Andrew Legg earned his second Mackey with a 29-second pin of Aaron Williams of Otsego at 189 pounds. Jarrod Pena was the last Ross champion when he took the heavyweight title by

pinning Ryan Mock of Perrysburg.

Ross got second-place finishes from Jake Gutschalk at 140, 145-pounder Kyle Wensinger, Myles Porter at 160 and Brandon Wolf at 171 pounds. Kyle Watts was fourth at 112 pounds.

The Little Giants face Sandusky and Clyde on Wednesday at Clyde.

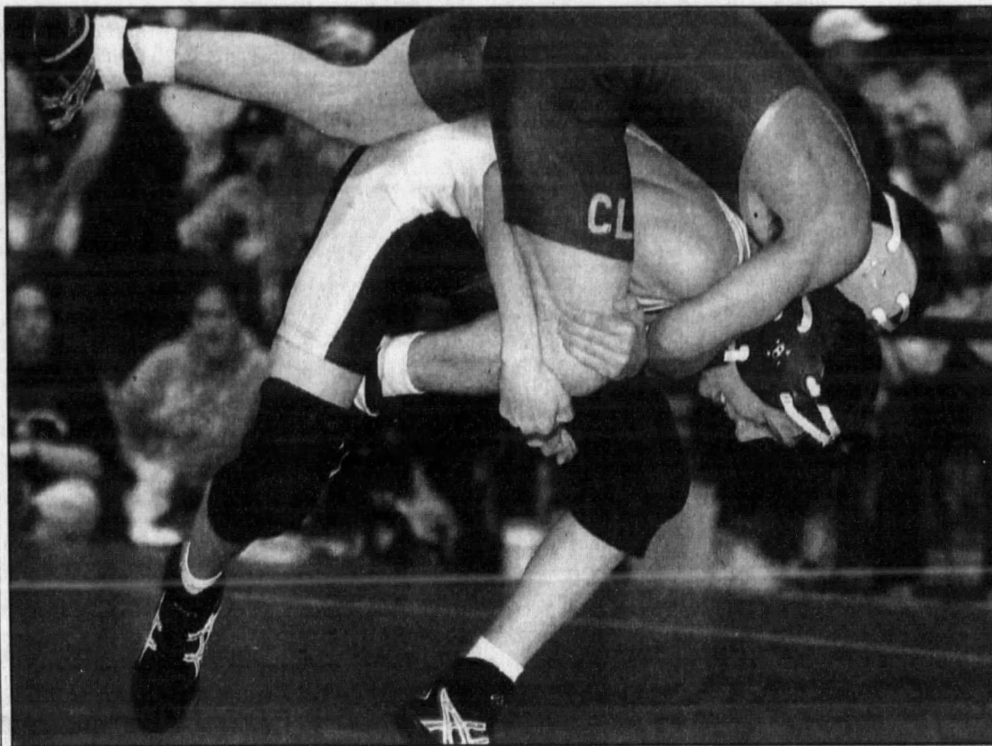

Clyde romps twice

Ross salvages GLL victory over rival Streaks

CLYDE — The Fremont Ross and Clyde wrestling teams both got what they came for during a double-dual Wednesday at Nancy E. Hanger Gymnasium.

The Fliers backed up their Division II state ranking by cruising to lopsided victories over Division I schools Ross and Sandusky.

And though they lost to Clyde, the Little Giants came away with a win in the most important match to them, a Great Lakes League affair with Sandusky.

The ninth-ranked Fliers blew away Ross, 50-18, and Sandusky, 58-17, and improved to 4-0 in dual matches. Freshman Robbie Michaels (103 pounds) and T.C. Hoffman (130) led the way with a pair of pins apiece.

as lopsided as they turned out. We had some kids step it up a couple notches."

The Little Giants rebounded for a 40-33 triumph over the Blue Streaks to improve to 2-1 in GLL action. Sandusky fell to 1-2 in the GLL.

"That's the one we wanted, but Clyde's always a good team to beat," said Ross junior 189-pounder Andrew Legg, who won a pair of matches. "Unfortunately, we didn't get to. But we've got a really young team. We just need a little more experience."

"It's a nice feeling," Clyde head coach Jim Carothers said. "We didn't probably think things were going to be

Brock Davis, who also claimed a pair of individual wins, clinched Ross's victory over Sandusky with a pin of Felix Scott in five minutes, 40 seconds. Davis, who normally wrestles at 125 pounds, moved up to face Scott because the Blue Streaks forfeited the 125-pound match.

"I bumped him up to 130 to go against one of their better kids," Ross head coach Grover Dowell said. "Otherwise, they would have beat us. He did a real nice job. I was real happy with Brock tonight."

"I did some switching around in that one that pretty much guaranteed it. I didn't expect it to be as close as it was."

Davis moved to 20-0 on the campaign. Before his pin of Scott, Davis earned a hard-fought 10-3 triumph over Clyde's J.R. Ysaguirre.

"That was a real intense match," Davis said of facing Ysaguirre. "We were going full go the whole match. ... We both wanted to win."

Legg also saw his record go to 20-0 with a pair of easy triumphs. He pinned Brandon Mitchell of Sandusky in 2:27 and turned in a 17-2 technical fall over Eric Schwartz of Clyde.

"I almost messed up in the beginning," Legg said of his match against Mitchell. "I tried to force something. I capitalized off it, though. He didn't wrestle. I've had that problem quite a bit this year. I just beat him in the down position."

Against Clyde, Sam Krueger and Chris Kayser picked up Ross's other victories. Krueger downed Marcelo Gonzales, 13-3, at 119

Hoffman also got two quick pins, taking down Tim Freeman of Ross in 2:28 and Scott of Sandusky in 3:15. The two pins made it three in a row for Hoffman, who won the Norwalk Invitational on Saturday with a pin.

"I'm always impressed when T.C. can pin anybody," Carothers said.

"But he's improving his pinning skills this year. He's a takedown-type guy."

Schwartz added one victory for Clyde by pinning his Sandusky foe, Michell, in 2:16.

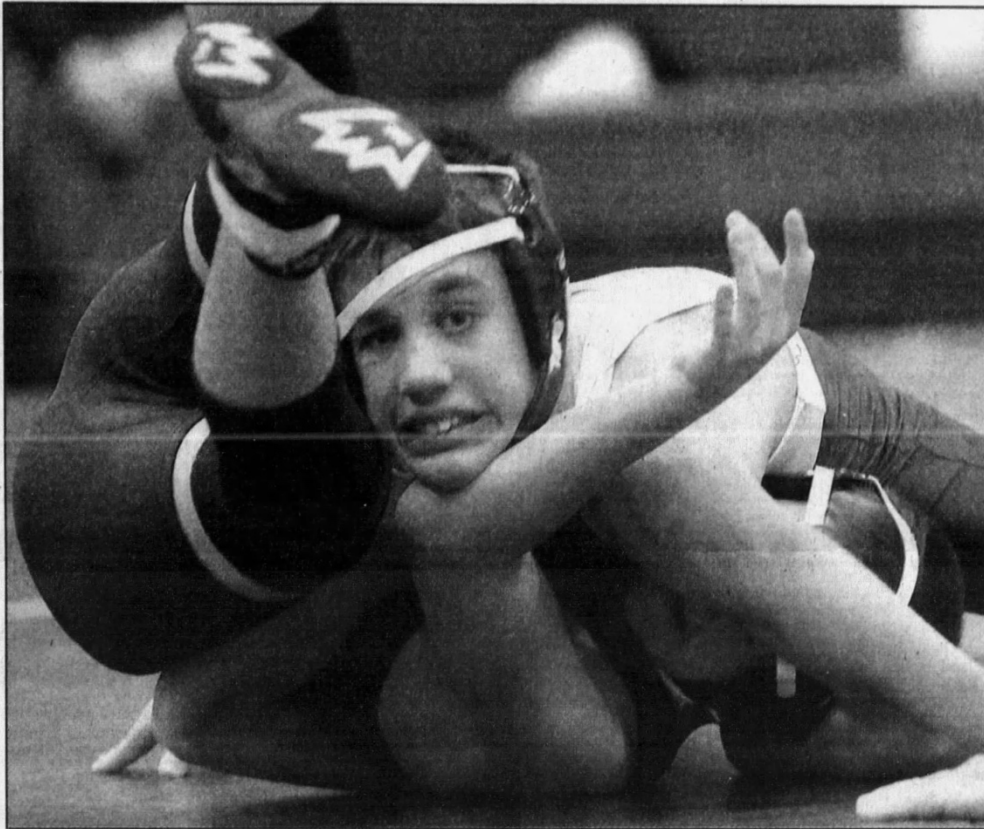

Porter leads Ross to must-win over Whitmer

Fremont Ross 171-pounder Myles Porter is a team wrestler. Bumped up from his normal 160-pound class, Porter pulled out an 11-9 overtime victory to key the Little Giants' 35-25 come-from-behind victory over Toledo Whitmer on Wednesday at the Purple Pit.

The victory was a must for Ross's Great Lakes League title defense. Entering the match, Ross, Napoleon and Findlay each had one GLL loss.

"I knew it was going to be close, but I didn't think it would be that close. Whitmer has some really nice kids," Ross head coach Grover Dowell said. "We talked about the match beforehand, and the kids knew they had to have this win or they'd kiss the championship goodbye."

Ross ran its league record to 3-1.

Porter's victory over Todd Ridgeway tied the match at 25 apiece. Although tired, he rallied to force the extra session and hit a double-leg takedown to end the match.

"Coming in, I knew it would be pretty close," Porter said of the bout. "I'm just glad I'm in as good a shape as I am. ... Everyone told me we needed the points. I just tried to come through in the clutch."

Said Dowell, "I bumped Myles up to 171 because our normal 171-pounder, Brandon Wolf, has been sick, and I thought he could handle it. Myles did a real nice job for us."

Andrew Legg won by forfeit at 189 pounds, and Chris Kayser earned a 10-2 victory over Ben Wright to seal the deal.

The Panthers (1-3 GLL) shuffled their lineup with hopes of pulling off the upset.

"We thought it would come right down to the wire," Whitmer head coach Rob Warren said. "Our heavyweight was in the match and ended up getting pinned, and he cost us three team points. That really hurt us. ... We weren't sure if we could manage a win at 215 with our 189-pounder. That was our only shot at the win."

Little Giant heavyweight Jarrod Pena pinned Dan Curry with a double-underhook throw in one minute, 41 seconds to start the match. Curry muttered some unkind words to the official and was hit with a flagrant misconduct call, resulting in the team point deduction.

Ross's Zac Brunner (103 pounds) pinned Jeff Moore-

head in 28 seconds, and Sam Krueger downed Ryan Macut 18-5 at 119 pounds to build a 16-3 Little Giant lead.

Brock Davis dropped a 7-2 bout to undefeated Damon Abitua of Whitmer. It was Davis' first loss of the season.

Said Dowell, "In Brock's behalf, he has a pulled hamstring. I know he was hurting and he didn't open up at all tonight. But that was a tough kid he wrestled."

Ross bounced back and took the 135-pound weight class when Derek Earhart pinned Derek Stender in 1:23.

The Panthers took the next four matches and took a 25-22 lead, their first of the night, when Clay Dubendorfer defeated Ross's Kevin Henry 16-5 at 160 pounds.

The Little Giants travel to Oregon Clay on Wednesday.
