Three Veterans Give Ross Potent Tennis Team; Bill Carver Is New Coach Of Netters

AT THE RISK OF PUTTING THE HEX ON THE Ross high tennis team in its match this afternoon with Toledo DeVilbiss, we'd like to print the observation that this season looks like a fine one for the netters.

Bolstered by such experienced lads as Dick Garcia, Jack Baron and Lonny Price, the Giants could be the No. 1 team in northwestern Ohio.

NEITHER WAS extended as they won singles matches last week in the opener against Sandusky. Baron trimmed Donald Yontz 6-0, 6-2; Garcia trampled Walter Herzog, 6-3, 6-1, and Price thumped Eugene Lauro, 6-0, 6-2.

Just how Coach Bill Carver will line up his squad in the district meet at Bowling Green is uncertain. He may use any combination he pleases but each school is permitted only one entry in doubles and in singles.

"Baron and Garcia went together like ham and eggs," Carver said in commenting on the Sandusky match. The two teamed up to win over Yontz and Herzog 6-1, 6-0.

Other top prospects are Bud Cross, Louis Lorenzen and Bob Lucas. All except Lucas competed against Sandusky.
