RELAY TEAM IS RANKED THIRD

Sherlow Disqualified After Winning Specialty;
Record Times

With the 150-yard medley relay team finishing in third place to score four points, Fremont Ross High's swimming team ended in tenth place in the state swimming meet at Columbus Saturday.

Coach N. B. Stults' team almost ranked up with the select group, however. A decision of the judges cut several of their points, and smashed a dream which Bill Sherlow has had.

Sherlow was apparently the winner in the record-breaking 100-yard breast stroke event, but the judges ruled that the Fremont splasher had made an illegal turn and disqualified him.

As a result, Haucke, of Cincinnati Western Hills, was given the victory with the record time of 1 minute 12.2 seconds. No other Fremont swimmers finished high enough for points.

Scoring 21 points, Western Hills became new champions of the state. Sandusky's team, which are the supposed champions of the northwest district, failed to score a point.

The teams finished in this order: Cincinnati Western Hills 21, Akron East 14, Canton McKinley 12, Columbus East 10, Cleveland Shaker Heights 10, Cleveland Lakewood 7, Hamilton 7, Akron St. Vincent 5, Cincinnati Woodward 5, Fremont Ross 4, Cleveland Heights 3, Dayton Steele 3, Columbus North 2, Cincinnati Hughes 2, Elyria 1.
