Ross Performs In District Swimming Meet

Fremont Ross joins with favorite Sandusky, Mansfield Senior, Lima Senior and Findlay in a five-team District swimming meet Saturday at Bowling Green State university, starting time 2 p.m.

Sandusky has topped all of the district participants in dual meets, Lima twice, Ross twice, Mansfield and Findlay once. Lima has stopped Mansfield and Findlay and Fremont has topped Findlay and Lima.

Records in the district: Sandusky 6-0, Lima and Mansfield 3-3, Fremont 2-6, Findlay 1-4.

Sandusky is defending District titlist.

First four boys in each event will advance to the State meet at Columbus March 10 and 11.

Team champion in the District and the runnerup will receive trophies and top individuals will receive medals.

SHS TEAM CHAMPION . . .

Ross Fourth In District Swim; Nine Boys Qualify For State

Fremont Ross finished fourth but qualified nine boys for this week's state swimming finals after District activity at Bowling Green Saturday.

Sandusky, as expected, walked off with the District team honors. SHS had 82 points, Mansfield Senior 65, Lima Senior 54, Fremont Ross 33, Findlay 18, Ontario nine, Perkins one.

The tremendous field cracked all District records except the 200-yard freestyle relay and that mark was tied.

First four boys in each event qualified for the state swimming meet scheduled Friday and Saturday at Columbus.

Qualifying for Ross were Tom Lloyd, fourth in the 200-freestyle in 2:19; Jack Jaisler, fourth in the 100-backstroke in the fine time of 1:04.3; Jim Kaufman, third in diving with 220.35 points; Dave Parker, third in the 200-individual medley in 2:34.6 which breaks his own school record; and both relay teams (Lloyd, Bruce Landis, Steve Weller, Dave Parker in the 200-freestyle, second in 1:42.9 and Jaisler, Bill Knoke, Jim Parker and Bob Cliburn, fourth in the 200-medley relay in 1:55.5).

First places in record-setting time included Carpenter of Lima, 23.8 in the 50-freestyle; Roadhouse, Ottawa Hills, 57.0 in the 100-butterfly; Beard of Mansfield, 2:05.9 in the 200-freestyle; Wilt of Lima, 1:01.7 in the 100-backstroke which broke the record of 1:02.2 by Jack Talbot of Ross; Taylor

of Lima, 1:08 in the 100-breaststroke; Wilt of Lima, 51.3 in the 100-freestyle which broke the record of 54.3 by Gordon Tod of Ross; Beard of Mansfield 2:21.4 in the 200-ind. medley; Sandusky (Keohler, Sidley, Zorn, Kessler), 1:48.6 in the 200-medley relay.

Scheid of Sandusky repeated as Sandusky diving champion. The Sandusky 200-freestyle relay team tied the District record of 1:38.
