

Campbell Takes First Place But Scott Wins

Although Wade (Soupy) Campbell, of Ross High, came in first setting a new course record of 10:26.1, Toledo Scott high school, state champions of 1934, won the district cross country title in a meet over the Ottawa Hills course Saturday afternoon, at Toledo.

Campbell was pressed hard all the way by Don Kern, the Scott High champion. Kern finished in 10:29, which was also better than

the old course record of 2:32 for the two mile jaunt. It was established in 1933 by Ken Sampson, of Scott.

Scott tallied the low score of 31 points, while Fremont Ross was second with 53 points. Others finished as follows: Toledo Libbey, 89; DeVilbiss, 109; and Stryker, 148.

Both Scott and Fremont Ross squads will be eligible to enter the state meet at Columbus November 16, Coach Harold Althoff said.

Biz Driftmeyer, of Fremont, was the second purple runner to finish in the district meet. He came in seventh. Others finished in the following order: George Mathern, 10th; Sam Broshious, 14th; Lester Rinebolt, 21st; James McGrady, 26th; and Eugene Hofelich, 27th. All of those runners, with Kern, Hanna, Furman, Smith, Bowers, Flath and Souder, of the state championship Scott team, will be eligible for the state gathering.
