Blind Wrestlers Here Saturday

Ross high school's wrestlers will make their 1954-55 debut Saturday night against a team composed entirely of sightless boys.

Opposing the Little Giants will be the Columbus School for the Blind. The match will be held in the National Guard Armory, starting at 7 p.m.

Coach Mal Mackey has a squad of 38 boys preparing for a schedule of 11 meets. After Saturday's meet, the Little Giants won't be in action again until Toledo Whitmer come here, January 7.

Eleven individual matches will be held Saturday. Weight classes are as follows: 103 pounds, 112, 120, 127, 133, 138, 145, 154, 165, 175 and heavyweight.

Not all of Fremont's competitors have been decided, Mackey said. Tom Rollins will wrestle in the 127-pound class, Terry Shanahan 103, Ken Weickert at 133, Larry Reed at 145, Ken Hirt 175 and Dave Wolshuck, heavyweight. Intra-squad competition determines the wrestlers in the various weights, Mackey said.

Ross Wrestlers Down Ohio Blind School

Ross high school's wrestlers won their opening match, 38-14, against the Ohio School for the Blind in the Armory Saturday night. About 200 fans turned out to see the handicapped youngsters put up a dogged scrap.

Bill Shiels, Wayne Michaels, Dale Wright and Jim Sale won by falls, worth five points. Decisions are worth three points.

The school is now located at Worthington, moving there from Columbus. It's a fully-accredited high school and now occupies a new multi-million dollar plant.

The wrestling team is coached by Lloyd Rush, a member of the Ohio State squad. Rush was unable to be here Saturday, the 12-man squad being in charge of the physical education director, Bernard Ryan. Four on his squad are totally blind, while a fifth is practically blind. The others are legally blind — under 22/100 vision.

This is the second year of competitive wrestling for the blind school. Last year's team compiled a winning record, numbering Fostoria among its victims. The squad competed against 11 blind schools in Philadelphia last season, finishing second.

The school has an enrollment of 200 ranging in age from 4 to 21.

Columbus did not have entries in the lightest (103 pounds) and heaviest weight classes, forfeiting in those divisions. Terry Shanahan, 103, and Dave Wolshuck, heavyweight, were slated to wrestle in those classes for Fremont. Wolshuck met Dana DeLagrange, a member of last year's team now on the O.S.U. wrestling squad, in an exhibition, with DeLagrange winning. In another exhibition, Ken Weichert of Fremont defeated Larry Clay, Columbus.

The next match will be held here January 7 against Toledo Central. Summary:

Ross high school's wrestlers lost a 24-21 decision to undefeated Toledo Whitmer in a hot scrap at Whitmer Thursday night. It was the first loss in three matches for Mal Mackey's competitors, who return to the mat Tuesday night in Fremont against Fostoria.

Whitmer, with Sylvania regarded as the class of the Toledo area, got off to a 13-3 lead and the Little Giants couldn't quite catch up. "I'll take the blame for this defeat," said Mackey. "I should have used at least one other boy in the lighter classes. If I had done so, I believe we would have won."

Whitmer will pay a return engagement here Feb. 15.

Trailing 24-11, Fremont picked up five points in each of the last two matches on falls. Ken Hirt pinned Rick Schliebner, a former Ross athlete, and Dave Wolshuck pinned Dave Lichenstein. Bill Shiets of Fremont won by a pin in the 133-pound class.

Ross high scored its third win in four wrestling matches Tuesday night with a 31-10 verdict over Fostoria before 200 fans in the armory.

The lopsided win kindled hopes of an upset win over the unbeaten Lima Central Dragons, who appear at the armory Friday night for a 7:30 engagement.

Lima is coached by Sep Pope, Lima Central football coach who will become an assistant next fall when Central and South merge.

Mal Mackey's grapplers lost only two of the 11 individual matches, both by falls, while Ken Hirt, 175 pounder, and Bill Shiets, 133, won by pinning their opponents. Other victories were by decisions.

Ross high school's wrestlers were upended by Lima Central, 26-15, in an exciting match witnessed by at least 225 fans in the armory Friday night.

Pins by Gene Courtney, 115-pounder, and Jim Little, 124, gave the Dragons a big early lead which Ross narrowed to three just over the midway point but the local boys couldn't quite catch up.

Ross wrestled without the services of Ron Kiser, who was unbeaten in four previous matches. The defeat left the Little Giants with a 3-2 mark. They entertain Sylvania, regarded as the class of Northwestern Ohio, in the armory next Friday.

Terry Shanahan got Ross off to a good start with a decision over Don Nutter in the 106-pound division. The 3-0 lead was erased and Lima shot ahead, 13-3, on the two falls, which are worth five points each.

Other individuals who won for Ross were Bill Sheets, a hard-working 137 - pounder and Larry Reed, a methodical 149 - pounder. Two matches resulted in draws.
