Ross rolls to historic title

Nothing could dampen the Fremont Ross Little Giants' spirits.

Not even a downpour.

The boys track and field team accepted its first conference championship plaque under a steady rain at Lima Senior High School on Friday.

"It's been pouring down rain all day," Fremont Ross coach Cathy Esposito said.

Wilhelm leads Giants' charge

"We are drowned rats. We don't care."

Ross won eight events to cruise to the title in the first year of the Greater Buckeye Conference.

The Little Giants tallied 158 points. Marion Harding (100) and Sandusky (98.5) rounded out the top three.

"It was an awesome performance," said Esposito, who was named the boys coach of the year. "They are all very excited."

Ashley Fischer's second-place effort in the 1,600-meter run was the best finish for the Ross girls, who finished last.

Ross's Adam Wilhelm was named top boys athlete of the conference.

Wilhelm set the school record with a 48.1 in the 400. The previous mark was set in 1968 by Steve Parker.

"That was so impressive," Esposito said. "It seemed like his eyes weren't even open because it was raining so hard."

Wilhelm also won the 200 and was on the winning 1,600 relay with Jordan Edwards, Tim Burris and Austin Young.

Nathan Bowen won the 1,600 and was on the winning 3,200 relay with Jay Ohms, Young and David Guardiola.

Burris (high jump) and Jorge Perez (discus) won field events for Ross, and Derek Hill (3,200) added a victory on the track.

Even more impressive, the Little Giants won the conference title without returning state qualifier Elon Simms, who was nursing a hip injury.

"Everybody was so nervous that they couldn't win without Elon running," Esposito said. "They didn't want to believe us that they could still win it."

Simms, who called himself an assistant to the assistant coaches, said it was "kind of depressing" watching the meet.

"But I'm glad to see them do so well," Simms said. "I'm very excited."
