Ross 4x800 ready to peak

Relay hopes for better split times

The members of the Fremont Ross boys 4x800 relay team are zeroing in on the two-minute mark.

Ross coach John Elder says someone on the team has to break it as the path to the state track and field meet begins today at the district meet in Mansfield.

"That wasn't the case last year," Elder said. "But the field is so strong now."

Junior Kurt Snyder, senior Clint Hill, senior Jeremiah Wagner and junior Jeremiah Smith say they have finally rounded into form to test that field.

"We're all in shape now," said Hill, who ran on the team at the state meet a year ago with Snyder, Wagner and Dane Snyder. "We're all capable of running around two-flat."

Hill has been the strongest all season, with Snyder taking time to adjust from basketball, Wagner battling shin injuries and Smith running a full season after missing last season with an ankle injury.

"They all have not run their best on the same day yet," Elder said. "That's what the goal is this week...definitely next week. We expect them to advance."

"It would be nice to have them run fast on their own, but they seem to run better when they're pushed."

The relay won at the Galion Invitational on May 2, finishing in 8 minutes, 7.1 seconds — four-tenths of a second off last year's state meet time.

eight-flat at the City league meet," Elder said. "We've beaten them all year long when we've run head-to-head against them. That gives us a lot of optimism."

Not coincidentally, the Galion Invitational was run in the most pleasant weather of the spring.

"Weather is the biggest factor

in my head," Wagner says. "We've had one great day. You can see by the time which conditions favor us."

Wagner is the best distance runner of the group, Smith has been the best 800 man at Ross since he was a freshman, Hill brings speed to the quartet and Snyder is the most versatile.

"We all hope we're going to be the one to break two minutes," Smith says. "But in the same sense, we know each other well enough that it doesn't make much difference."

Smith says he hopes Snyder runs 1:59 on the lead leg, giving the rest of the group incentive to match him.

"That's the only way (to advance)," Wagner says.

Snyder and Hill have run 2:00 splits this spring, while Wagner and Smith have had bests of 2:01.

"You have to tell yourself you're going to finish strong," Snyder says.

That's been the goal all year.
