Little Giants Top Clyde 10-0 Struggle

Cold weather was the only problem Tuesday as Ross stopped Clyde, 10-0, Tuesday in the opening game of the Class AA Sectional baseball tournament. With high winds and extreme cold making it good weather for anything but baseball Terry Bork and Larry Whatley combined to shut out the Fliers on Anderson field.

Ross must now await the outcome of the game scheduled tonight between Perkins and Port Clinton. This winner will meet Ross Friday, weather permitting, to determine the team that advances in tournament play.

The Tuesday game was called at the end of six innings because of the weather conditions.

Bork extended his record of only two earned runs all season to 25-1-3. He worked the first five innings until Coach Don Purvis brought in Whatley to give Bork a respite from the cold. Whatley responded by striking out two and forcing a

groundout by the third man he faced in the final inning.

Bork in working the five innings struck out nine and didn't issue a walk.

Both teams had only three hits, but Ross took advantage of five walks, two hit batsmen, and eight Clyde errors.

The game was put out of

reach in the third when the Little Giants scored seven runs on one walk, one hit batsman, three singles and four errors.


