An infusion of newcomers to an experienced nucleus gives the Fremont Ross High School boys track and field team high aspirations for the 1993 season.

In addition to state qualifiers Tyrone Price, who ran on the 4x400 team, Jeff Pasch and Tony Franks, the Little Giants will feature several newcomers.

Sophomores Adolph McKinstry and Charles Woodson, as well as four freshman are expected to contribute, Ross coach John Elder said. Former Junior Olympian Jason Lather is one of the freshman.

"We are counting on taking more than last year to the state meet plus scoring in the meet," Elder said.

Price runs the 200 and long jumps, while senior letterman Franks is aiming for a return trip to Columbus in the discus.

"Tony and Tyrone know what it takes to get there (state)," Elder said. "They are providing great leadership."

Pasch, a junior letterman who was ninth at the state meet last year in the 800 run, also provides veteran leadership along with hurdler Efrain Moreno.

Junior Tim Leeth along with sophomore Dane Snyder will lead the distance corps while sophomore Nathan Rhodes is strong in the 400 and 800.

The Giants need to find pole vaulters to support Melvin Rusch to reach ultimate success.

The Fremont Ross girls track team is moving closer to Great Lakes League powers Toledo Whitmer and Napoleon.

"We are not ready at this point," Ross coach John Elder said, "but we are better than we were last year at this point."

Ross finished sixth in the GLL last year. With only two "experienced" seniors (Deb Lilley and Crystal Depew), Elder is counting on "hard work and a positive attitude to keep the Little Giants moving up."

Liley will run the 400 and 800 again this year, and Depew will throw the discus. Heather Mears (800) and hurdler Michelle Jenkins are the lone returning juniors that have lettered.

Lisa Elder, a sophomore, headlines in the field events for the Little Giants after advancing to the state meet in the long jump a year ago.

Sophomores expected to contribute on the track are Kristina Corthell and Mindy Nortson in the 400, Tressa Young (hurdles and relays), Tori Kille (high jump and relays) and Carey Gill (distance).

Elsewhere, Oak Harbor's girls defeated Lakota 78-50 and the Rockets boys topped the Raiders 75-57.


"I thought we could beat them," Elder said. "Right now, we are weak (no depth) in the 110 high hurdles, pole vault and high jump."

Elder said bright spots were Jason Lather (victories in the 100, 200 and long jump); the winning 4x800 relay team of Erfain Moreno, Rick Meyer, Tim Leeth and Jeff Pasch; and Tony Franks' victories in the shot put and discus.

"A big surprise," Elder said of the Little Giants' performance. "I thought, and still do, we are a year away but we challenged and scared last year's GLL champs."

The bright spots were numerous, according to Elder, and they included a 1-2 finish by Martha Hoffman and Mindy Norton in the 400 dash.

The coach highlighted middle distance runner Sarah Williams; the winning 4x800 (Aqua Yost, Deb Lilley, Williams and Heather Mears) and 4x200 (Shante Flores, MauRicka McKinstry, Lisa Elder and Tressa Young) relay squads; McKinstry and Flores in the sprints; Crystal DePew's win in the discus; and the efforts of Tirza Hale and Sarah Pfleger in the shot put.

Franks, Paeth set school records

Two Fremont athletes, Tony Franks of Ross and St. Joseph Central Catholic's Mike Paeth, broke school records in field events Tuesday to highlight high school track and field action.

Franks' discus throw of 165 feet, 5 inches bettered the old mark of 163-10, while Paeth's 13-foot pole vault broke his own school record of 12 feet, 9 inches.

Ross defeated Napoleon 84-47, and St. Joe topped Sandusky St. Mary's Central Catholic and Port Clinton. The Crimson Streaks compiled 73 points to 56 for the Panthers and 35 for the Redskins.

Franks also won the shot put, and freshman Jason Lather won the 100 dash, 200 dash and the long jump. Ross also won the 4x800 and 4x100 relays.

Paeth also won the high jump for St. Joe, and Kevin Huntley won both hurdles races.

In the girls' meets, Napoleon beat Ross 87-30 and St. Mary's topped St. Joe and Port Clinton. The Panthers' 78 points were better than St. Joe's 45 and Port Clinton's 34.

Aqua Yost in the 1600 and Sarah Williams in the 800 had the only firsts for the Ross girls.

Angie Smith won the long jump and tied for first in the high jump to pace the St. Joe girls. Chrissy Branda won the 100 and ran a leg of St. Joe's winning 4x100 team.

Clyde-Eastwood

Highlighting girls action Tuesday was Clyde's Kelly Taylor, who broke a school record in the 3200 run. Taylor's time of 12:30 was 4.3 seconds lower than Sarin Weidle's previous school record, which was set last year.

Clyde, which also got two victories from Melanie Jenne in the hurdles race, defeated Eastwood 82-46. In the boys' meet, Clyde won every event except the shot put and beat the Eagles 113-19.

In other boys' meets, Danbury topped Gibsonburg 68-55, Lakota ran past Tiffin Calvert and Old Fort and Oak Harbor defeated Liberty Benton 85-47.

In other girls' action, Gibsonburg defeated Danbury 70-58, Lakota topped Calvert and Old Fort and Liberty Benton beat Oak Harbor 91-37.

Price leads Ross to Hendricks track title

CLYDE — Fremont Ross, behind Tyrone "Toddie" Price and Jason Lather, overtook host Clyde to win the 7th A.W. Hendricks Invitational Track and Field Meet Saturday at the new Clyde all-weather facility.

Clyde led Ross 35½-32½ after six events in Division I before Price and the Little Giants kicked it in.

"We didn't begin the meet very well," Ross coach John Elder said after his team amassed 112½ points, "but as the meet rolled on, we started getting stronger."

Clyde finished second with 89½ points. Margaretta had six and Woodmore four in Division II, finishing behind winner New London's 28.

Sandusky won the girls Division I title with 64 points and Clyde was second with 60½. Ross was seventh with 27.

Margaretta won the Division II girls crown with 73. Woodmore, despite having only two girls, was second with 24.

Elder said he was concerned with his boys squad after the 1600-meter run and was afraid the Little Giants were in for a long day.

"It all happened after the mile (run)," Elder said. "I was worried because we didn't score any points in that event. I didn't know what it would be like after that, but Toddie was the iron man. He gave a hell of a performance."

Hendricks honored at meet

CLYDE — The man behind the name of the meet was honored Saturday at the 7th A.W. Hendricks Track Invitational.

Art Hendricks, former Clyde High School track coach who led the 1953 team to the state title, was presented with a plaque naming the new all-weather track and field facility at Clyde High School in honor of him.

Hendricks accepted the plaque from Clyde-Green Springs School Superintendent Stan Mounts prior to the finals of the 13-team meet.

Hendricks spent 28 years as a coach and teacher in the Clyde school system.

Along with Hendricks, members of his 1953 track team were also recognized.

"I'm originally from Ross," Clyde coach Mike Martin said, "and when I came here he was already a legend, and he still is now."

The plaque made it permanent.

4x100 relay team and immediately won the 400 dash in 54.4 seconds. He also ran the anchor leg of Little Giants' winning 4x400 relay team.

"I had to run quite a bit," Price said. "I was tired, but I'm a senior on the team and I had to get it done to set an example for the young ones."

Lather, a freshman, shared co-outstanding performer honors with Andy Madell of Clyde. Lather won the 200-meter dash, running a record 22.7 seconds. He also ran a leg of the Little Giants' 4x400 relay team that sealed the win. He also was second in the 100 and sixth in the long jump.

Madell broke two meet records, winning the 1600 in 4:40.4

and the 800 in 2:05.8.

"We got a lot of good performances by a lot of key people, which is what we need," Elder said. "Tony (Franks) had a good day in the shot and discuss... Melvin Rusch came through more than enough in the pole vault. Jeremiah Wagner had a great two-mile (3200) run."



Tony Franks and Price were accorded the most valuable honors for the boys track team and Heather Mears won the honor for the girls track squad.


