ALTHOFF ENTERS 6 IN STATE MEET

Coach Whitey Althoff will take six of his Little Giant track performers to the state meet in Columbus, last event on the annual spring cinder program, this weekend.

Dave Brocksieker, who won the 440 dash and Elmer Nickel, second in the discus throw, at the district meet last Saturday, have been entered in those two events and will go to Columbus Friday for the preliminary trials.

The 880-yard relay team, which also placed second in the district, will run Saturday, but Coach Althoff was uncertain as to its personnel. Brocksieker may run one leg, depending on how he does in the 440, while Jim Wisbon, Emmett Mackey, Jim Welker and Chuck Robertson are the other possible starters.

SCHOOLBOYS IN FINAL SPORTS EFFORT TODAY

State Titles In Baseball, Track, Tennis And Golf To Be Decided

COLUMBUS, O., May 23.—UP—Fair weather greeted Ohio schoolboy athletes today in their drive for state high school championships in track and field, baseball, golf and tennis after nature had given them a miserable start in Friday's preliminaries.

Trackmen started on a day-long program of 14 events, with Springfield and Cleveland East Tech the favorites in the Class A division and the Ohio Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphans' Home of Xenia the top-heavy favorite in Class B.

East Tech, which shared the track title with Cleveland Heights a year ago, qualified four men in yesterday's five preliminary speed events. Springfield, second last year, qualified five men.

Favorites Win

Xenia Orso Home, which has won two consecutive championships in the lower division, qualified only one athlete in the preliminary events but that was largely due to the fact that its strength lies in events in which no qualifying trials were necessary.

Mark Moots of Canton St. Johns, Phil Snouffer of Worthington and Merl Friess of Sylvania were next with 80s.

Sylvania was leading the four-man teams with an aggregate of 345 strokes for the first 18.
