CLASS AA DISTRICT TRACK

Sandusky Faces 11-Team Challenge For Qualifiers

Fremont Ross will join 10 other schools in chasing Sandusky for honors Saturday in the District Class AA track meet at Strobel field in Sandusky. Ross managed to finish second and qualify eight boys for the regional meet in last year's district.

In addition to Ross and Sandusky, the schools competing in the district meet will be Bellevue, Clyde, Eastwood, Huron, Norwalk, Tiffin Columbian, Oregon Clay, Port Clinton, Perkins and Vermilion.

Two top boys in each event will qualify to compete in the

regional meet to be held at Mansfield. The eventual target of the competitors is the state track meet May 28 in Columbus. Four boys from the regional in each event will advance to state.

Ross qualified five boys in four events in 1965 and two of the boys who made the trip to Mansfield are back in action. These are Fred Tolhurst, discuss, and Craig Swartz, who ran anchor for the Ross mile relay team a year ago. Swartz has not been out for track all season and is just rounding into shape at district time.

Tolhurst has yet to match in competition his 149-8½ toss which was good for second place in district a year ago. His best to date this year has been 141.

Ross took only one first place a year ago when Don Roberts pole vaulted 13½ feet.

The district meet will get underway Saturday with all field events and preliminaries in 100, 220-yard runs, low and high hurdles starting at 10 a.m. Finals in running events will start at 1 p.m.

The 1965 district meet was one of record-setting. Seven marks fell in the activity with six of the marks set by Sandusky runners. Seven of the 14 district records are held by Sandusky runners.

There will be two defending champions in the district field — Bob Nichols, discuss, Port Clinton, and Willie Amison, high hurdles, Sandusky.

CLASS A DISTRICT TRACK:

Elmore Defends Crown In 25-School Field Here

Athletes from 25 schools will compete for four regional qualifying berths in each event Saturday during the Class A district track meet to be run at Harmon field. Meet Manager Richard Sherman has indicated the preliminaries and field events will begin at 10 a.m. Running event finals are to answer a 1 p.m. gun.

Nine qualifiers from last year, including three district champions, will be making a return bid in the Saturday meet. Defending district champions are Tom Spitzer, Genoa, shot put; Bob Wescotte, Genoa, 880-yard run, and Dave Hoskinson, Westwood, 220-yard dash.

Times this season indicate Hoskinson and Wescotte could have trouble repeating, while Spitzer, also defending state Class A shot put champion, remains in a class by himself. He is the only putter in the district to have surpassed 50 feet this season.

Wescotte's best time for this season in his specialty, 2:11, has been surpassed by four other runners. Even Wescotte's winning time of a year ago, 2:05.8, has been topped by Scott Chaney, Lakota, who has been clocked as fast as 2:04.9.

Hoskinson runs into a similar problem in the 220-yard dash where two other runners have posted times better than his .23.5 best for this season. A year ago Hoskinson was able to win the 220-yard district dash with a .23.8 timing and this has been bettered by five runners, including himself, this spring. Fastest 220-yard time to date has been a .22.4 by Margaretta's Barry Brunner.

In addition to the three champions, the qualifiers for regional a year ago back in action are Mike Grant, Thompson, 100 and 220-yard dashes; Hoskinson, 110-yard dash; John Salazar, Green Springs, mile; Russ Damschroder, Elmore, and Fred Poneman, Ottawa Hills, high jump; Herman Gant, Margaretta, pole vault.

Elmore is the defending champion in the district meet and is rated with a good chance to repeat. Clyde, most serious challenge of a year ago, has jumped to Class AA this season. Lakota and Rossford are strong contenders who competed a

Rossford, Thompson, Westwood and Woodville.

First and second place teams will receive trophies. First place will score six points in each event; second place, four; third place, three; fourth place, two, and fifth place, one.

Heat committee for the district meet includes George Gruse, Art Hendricks, Bob Netz, Dale Swartzmiller and meet manager Sherman.

Sandusky Wins As Expected

SANDUSKY — It was a day of disappointment for Fremont Ross track fans Saturday as the Little Giants fell flat in efforts to be one of the Sandusky-chasers in the Class AA district track meet. Ross garnered only eight points and failed to qualify a man for the regional meet at Mansfield.

Sandusky won as expected and received its most serious challenge from Tiffin Columbian, a team which had to win the final event to nip Ross in a dual meet last week. Sandusky was in a class by itself with 81 points.

Port Clinton and Clyde were among the more impressive teams with fourth and fifth place finishes. Only four points separated the fifth place Clyde from the second-place Tiffin.

Clyde runners captured the mile relay with record time of 3:32.9. Running the mile relay for the Fliers were Carl Smart, Tim Murphy, Bob Carter and Paul Imke. Smart also qualified for the regionals by taking second in the 180-yard low hurdles behind the record tying time of Sandusky's Willie Amison.

Five records were broken, a new one set and two tied in the fast competition. The new record is one that is likely to stand as Tiffin Columbian's Jim Speaker ran the two mile run in 9:51.6. He was the first runner in district to break 10 minutes for the new event.

Records to fall were set by Ken Krueger, Sandusky, discus, 159-6½; Roud Klag, Clay, high

jump, 6-2½; Willie Amison, Sandusky, 120-yard high hurdles, :14.4; Emmett Phillips, Sandusky, 440-yard dash, :52.5; and Clyde in the delay.

Amison tied the low hurdle mark with a :20.2 timing and Ron Roberts of Ross had his pole vault mark of 13-0 tied by Ron Terrell, Sandusky, and Tim Kontak, Clay.

Bad luck was with Ross as Ben Chambers was pressing the leaders in the low hurdles when he hit the fifth hurdle.

The Ross mile relay team finished fourth with running being done by Rusty Williams, Dave Longanbach, Craig Swartz and Ben Chambers. The Ross 880-relay team of Tim Arnold, Craig Swartz, Dave Longanbach and Steve Parker placed fifth with a 1:34.1 timing. The mile relay time for Ross was 3:38.

Other Ross points were earned by Tim Arnold, fifth in the 100-yard dash, and Steve Parker, fourth in the 220-yard dash.
