DISTRICT GOLF TOURNAMENT:

Findlay Wears Crown, Ross Finishes Fourth, St. Joseph Returns To Sport

FINDLAY — Findlay high school won all the qualifying berths as expected, Ross with three sophomores made a surprisingly strong showing and Fremont St. Joseph made its debut in the golfing wars Friday in the Northwestern Ohio District Golf tournament.

Playing on the Findlay Country Club course the Findlay team repeated as district champions with a 314-stroke total. This was 13 strokes above their 301 winning total of a year ago but ten strokes better than the nearest rival, Lima Shawnee. Tom Beegle and Tom Norris

of Findlay tied for medalist honors with rounds of 74. This meant that rather than a possible six qualifiers (winning team and two medalists) from the district for the state meet there will be only four.

Norris was declared medalist after winning a sudden death with his team mate on the fourth hole.

Fremont Ross finished fourth among the 18 teams in the tournament with a 348 total. Bill Wingard, number one man for Ross, fired a 78 with rounds of 41-37 to tie for fifth in the medalist competition.

The Findlay course is par 36-37-37 and Wingard missed a six foot putt to deprive him of even par on the second nine holes. He recovered and came back strong after a rough start. Wingard was in a trap on each of the first three holes, taking bogeys on each. After being three over par on the first three holes, he was only three over for the final 15.

St. Joseph, which had no dual meets, participated to insure its eligibility for competition when golf will be resumed on a full-scale. The Crimson Streaks with Tommy Powers firing an 83 for low had a 394-stroke total, good for 12th best score by a team.
