Little Giants eliminated from playoffs by Sandusky

The Fremont Ross Little Giants softball team fell victim to the Sandusky Blue Streaks by a score of 4-0 Tuesday afternoon in Fremont.

Blue Streaks pitcher Ashley Gilbert pitched seven scoreless innings and went 4-4 at the plate with an RBI.

"I think I did a very good job of hitting my spots," said Gilbert. "I forced the offense to hit a lot of ground balls. Not only that, but my offense came together, I was pretty happy about that. Our whole team played pretty well."

The game remained a pitcher's duel throughout the entire game until the seventh inning. Fremont Ross had the bases loaded with one out in the bottom of the first inning, but wasn't able to bring anyone around to score.

Following the first inning, the two teams were set down in consecutive order in the second and the third inning. Ashley Butler had a lead-off double in the top of the fifth, but wasn't able to come across to score.

The Little Giants clinched a share of the Greater Buckeye Conference crown with Friday's win over Findlay, and then backed into the outright league title when the Trojans lost Saturday to Napoleon.
