## Trio of juniors lead Ross golf team

Dave Fleming hopes a nucleus of Mark Gottron, Ryan Reidmaier and Joey Chung will help Fremont Ross develop into a competitive golf team.

"They are going to be the mainstays," said Fleming, who begins his 14th season at Ross after taking over for Charlie Baker in 1976. "They are very sound players."

Ross opens the season today at Fremont Country Club against Bowling Green and Lakota.

The Little Giants finished with a dual meet record of 14-6 a year ago but failed to advance past district competition.

"The kids are more on than off," Fleming said. "Maybe by that time of year (the district), they'll feel comfortable in high-level competition."

"Get out of district, that would be a good goal ... get to regional as a team."

Gottron, Reidmaier and Chung are all juniors.

"They keep it in play," Fleming said. "They don't get in trouble and they're good iron players so they hit a lot of greens."

Seniors Brad Meade and Mike Byrnes will compete for the final two varsity spots with juniors Chad Baker and Bill Lowery.

A pair of sophomores, Jamie Russell and Dan Swaisgood, could step into the picture.

"Russell made the team as a freshman and over the last year, he's really improved," Fleming said. "Swaisgood just missed the cut last year, and he's really hitting the ball well."

Senior Jason McKnight, juniors Chris Wolf and Dave Talmier, sophomore Ryan Woodrich and freshman Dave Zinkand round out the squad.

Fleming is taking a look at Jesse Langston this week. Langston is a move-in from Georgia who is accustomed to playing scholastic golf in the spring.

"I have some guys who can hit it hard," Fleming said, "but they don't know where it's going."

Except for the nucleus.

CLYDE — Upper Sandusky captured its third straight team title Saturday at the 12-team Bellevue Invitational at Green Hills Golf Course.
