Ross swim teams split

Aqua Giants boys take 8 firsts

SANDUSKY — Ross's boys swim team opened with a vengeance Wednesday, sinking Sandusky 104-68 in a meet in the Sandusky High School natatorium.

The girls, however, fell to the Lady Blue Streaks 101-64.

"We had a lot of good times for this time of the season," Ross Coach Art Bucci said about the boys' impressive opening meet. "We had a lot of good times and our depth showed."

The Aqua Giants boys won eight events including a 1-2-3 sweep in the diving event.

Tom McDonald won the 100 butterfly in 58.5 seconds and took the backstroke in 1:00.96 to be the one of two double winners for Ross.

McDonald also swam on the Aqua Giants' winning medley relay. He was teamed with Brian Mowery, Andy Scott and Bill Taylor with the quartet clocking at 1:47.89 for the event.

"That was a very good time," Bucci said.

Scott was the other double winner for Ross. He splashed to a 23.4 clocking in the 50-yard freestyle sprint and came back to win the backstroke in 1:00.96.

The other individual winners for Ross included Todd Vogel in the breaststroke with a time of 1:13.34. Jon Lagrou led the sweep in the diving, racking up 204.2 points. Second in the event went to Ryan Nuhfer with 200.4 points. Third belonged to Mike Nighswander with 159.4 points.

Seconds for the Aqua Giants went to Mike Mulholand in the 200 free in 2:03; Mowery in the 100 free in 52.5, Rob Penrod in the 500 free in 5:35.5 and the 400 freestyle relay team of Todd Williams, Brad Shank, Brian Schaaf and Shawn Overmyer in 4:00.84.

"It was a good victory for us," Bucci said, "especially because it was Sandusky."

On the Lady Aqua Giants side of the ledger, Sandusky used its youth to trip Ross.

"They had a fantastic group of freshman," Ross assistant Coach Beth Caster said. "They killed us in depth."

But while the outcome was glum, Caster pointed out that three of the Ross swimmers posted times that got qualified them for the district meet.

Juli Schaaf qualified in the 50 and 100 freestyle sprints, Todi Heslet in the 100 butterfly and 200 individual medley and Jamie Brudzinski in the 500 freestyle.

Schaaf won the 50 free in 26.91 and came back to win the 100 in 1:00.99. Heslet was first in the fly in 1:11.02 and finished second in the 200 IM in 2:39.05.

Brudzinski posted a 6:23.49 while finishing third in the 500.

The Lady Aqua Giants had one other first, winning the 400 free relay in 4:18.32. Members of the team were Heslet, Beth Goins, Tina Streeter and Schaaf.

The medley relay of Lori Nighswander, Dawn Vogel, Brudzinski and Goins finished second in 2:18.03. Nighswander was second in the backstroke in 1:15.59 while Vogel was second in the breaststroke in 1:26.46.

Familiar finale: Chris vs. Martina

MELBOURNE, Australia — Once again, it will be Chris Evert Lloyd versus Martina Navratilova.

The two best women players in the world will meet for the 67th time Friday to decide the champion of the \$1.5 million Australian Open tennis championship.

Both struggled through semifinal matches Thursday to earn a meeting that will also decide which of them is ranked

No. 1 for the year.

Defending champion Evert Lloyd had to survive a set point against her in the second set of her controversial 6-1, 7-6 triumph over fifth-seeded Claudia Kohde-Kilsch of West Germany, while second-seeded Navratilova triumphed 6-7, 6-1, 6-4 in a thriller against third-seeded Hana Mandlikova of Czechoslovakia.

Both Lloyd, the top seed, trailed the powerful West German 5-6 in the tiebreaker and

clearly hit a shot out — apparently giving the set to Kohde-Kilsch.

But the ball was called in, and two points later the 30-year-old American had wrapped up the match.

Top-seed Ivan Lendl of Czechoslovakia had no trouble in moving into the men's singles semifinals with a 7-6, 6-2, 6-1 victory over unseeded Englishman John Lloyd, Evert Lloyd's husband.

Aqua Giants boys fourth, girls seventh in NOAC Swim Relays

SANDUSKY — Fremont Ross finished fourth in the boys division and seventh in the girls portion of the Northwest Ohio Aquatic Conference (NOAC) Relays Saturday at Perkins High School.

The Aqua Giants won two boys events: diving and the 200 freestyle relay.

In the latter race, the Ross quartet of Brian Mowry, Bill Taylor, Mike Mulholand and Andy Scott wet a meet record with a clocking of 1:34.261.

The diving duo of Ryan Nuhfer and Jon Lagrou had 203.05 points to finish in the top spot in that competition.

Sylvania Southview won the event with 80 points. Ross had 62 points for fourth.

Ross took third in three events. The 800 free relay squad of Tom McDonald, Rob Penrod, Mulholand and Scott recorded an 8:07.84 to finish second to Perkins. The backstroke relay team of Penrod, Taylor, Dave Voggenthaler and McDonald recorded a 3:06.626 to take the runner-up slot that event.

The third runner-up finish for the Ross boys was in the 400 free relay. Scott, McDonald, Taylor and Mowry splashed the 400 yards in 3:30.36.

Northview won the girls meet with 118 points. Ross tallied 22

points.

The Lady Aqua Giants best finishes was a fourth and three fifths. The team of Tod Heslet, Brenda Audorff, Tina Streeter and Julie Schaaf was third in the 800 free in 4:20.06.

The Ross girls were fifth in the 800 free, 300 individual medley and the 200 free relay.

Jamie Brudzinski, Audorf, Julie Smith and Streeter comprised the 800 team which finished in 9:54.91. In the

individual medley relay, Heslet, Smith and Schaaf clocked in 3:41.206, good for fifth. The other fifth was in the 200 free relay with the team of Bell Goins, Kathy Sabiers, Denise Dumbroff and Schaaf recording a 1:56.674.

CASTALIA — The Ross boys swim team picked up an easy victory and some valuable experience for its younger swimmers in a dual meet with Margarettta Wednesday.

The Aqua Giants downed the Polar Bears 108-56, winning eight events.

"I was really pleased with the times this early in the year," said Coach Art Bucci. "A lot of young kids did well. Everybody got to swim in two events."

Individual winners for Ross included Rob Penrod, Ty Weickert, Mike Mullholand, Tom McDonald, Bill Taylor and Todd Vogel.

Penrod won the 200-yard individual medley in 2:23.9, Weickert won the diving competition with 193.5 points, Mullholand won the 100 freestyle in 54.8, McDonald took the 500 freestyle in 5:23.8, Taylor captured the 100 backstroke in 1:06.7 and Vogel won the 100 breaststroke in 1:12.8.

Two Ross relay teams were also victorious. The 200 medley team of Penrod, Vogel, Andy Scott and Mullholand won in 1:57.5, and the 400 freestyle team of Brian Mowry, Scott, Taylor and McDonald won in 3:33.9.

Both the boys and girls teams will be at Sandusky this Saturday beginning at 1 p.m.

Both Ross swim teams drub Port Clinton foes

PORt CLINTON — Both the Ross High School boys and girls swim teams dominated Port Clinton in a high school dual meet in the Port Clinton High School natatorium Tuesday.

The Ross boys won 117-54 and the girls 111-53.

A pair of school records were set by the Aqua Giants. Ryan Nuhfer wiped out a 12-year-old

record in diving while Julie Schaaf established a new mark in the girls 100-yard breaststroke.

Nuhfer chalked up 242.10 points for his six dives. That shattered the 233.5 points set by Rob Serwin in 1973. Schaaf recorded a 1:22.46 for the other record.

There were three triple winners for the girls and two for the boys.

Lori Nighswanter won the 200 individual medley in 2:44.14 and

the 100 back in 1:18.2 for the Lady Aqua Giants. Todi Heslet splashed home first in the butterfly in 1:09.22 and the 200 free with a district qualifying time of 2:16.69. In addition to her record setting performance in the breaststroke, Schaaf won the 50 free sprint in 27.09 seconds.

All three swam on the winning 200 medley relay along with Kathy Sablers.

The medley relay team was a

fraction of a second away from the Ross school record of 2:08.9 with a winning effort of 2:09.09.

Other firsts for the Ross girls were by Tina Streeter in the 100 free (1:05) and Jamie Brudzinski in the 500 free (6:22.32). The free relay team of Streeter, Julie Smith, Brenda Audorff and Brudzinski won that event in 4:29.88.

In the boys competition, McDonald won the butterfly in 58.14 and the backstroke in

1:00.11 while Scott won the 50 and 100 freestyle sprints in 23.42 and 52.28, respectively. Both were on the winning medley relay team with Brian Mowry and Bill Taylor. The medley team posted a 1:47.32.

Other boys wins went to Mowry in the 200 IM with a 2:17.6, Brian Schaaf in the 500 free in 5:29.99 and Mike Mulholand with a 2:03.12 clocking in the 200 free.

UPPER ARLINGTON — The Fremont Ross High School boys swim team brought home three first places and a ton of good experience while absorbing a 107-64 loss Friday at the hands of defending state champion Upper Arlington.

The girls lost 124-45. "We had a lot of good swims," Ross Coach Art Bucci said. "A lot of the kids lowered their times."

Ross diver Ryan Nuhfer led a one-two-three sweep in the diving. He totaled 213.20 points to finish ahead of teammates Tom Weikert and Mike Nighswander.

Other firsts went to Andy Scott in the 50-free in 23.18, Brian Mowry in the 100 free in 51.37 and Tom McDonald in the backstroke in 59 seconds flat.

In the girls meet, the medley relay team of Lori Nighswander, Kathy Sabiers, Todi Heslet and Julie Schaaf established a Ross record with a 2:07.83 clocking. That wiped out the old record of 2:08.0 set in last season district meet.

The Lady Aqua Giants' only first was in the 100 free with Schaaf winning in 1:00.7.

"It was a good meet for us," Bucci claimed. "We went up against some good kids, swimmers that we will see down the road."

Ross boys clinch 93-81 victory over Napoleon in final event

NAPOLEON — Ross was forced into a must win situation but met the challenge Saturday in a boys/girls high school swim meet at Napoleon High School.

The Ross boys team won the final event, the 400 freestyle relay, to splash past Napoleon 93-81 but the Ross girls sank 107-62.

The Aqua Giant boys quartet of Mike Mullholand, Todd Williams, David Voggenthaler and Brian Schaaf had just enough to nudge Napoleon in the

final event. The Ross team recorded a 3:48.02 — Napoleon 3:51.84 — to insure the Ross victory.

The Aqua Giants held an 81-77 lead after 10 events of the 11-event competition.

The Ross boys picked up firsts in the medley relay, 50 and 100 freestyles, diving and the butterfly to go with the freestyle relay win.

The medley team of Tom McDonald, Brian Mowry, Andy Scott and Bill Taylor finished in 1:47.38. Scott was first in the 50 in 23.31 seconds and Mowry won

the 100 freestyle in 51.07.

McDonald won the butterfly in 56.78 and Ryan Nuhfer scored 198.70 points for first place in diving.

Todi Heslet's Ross school record of 6:03.8 in the 500 freestyle highlighted the girls meet for the Aqua Giants. Heslet finished third in the event after she had won the 100 freestyle in 1:09.49.

The only other first for the Ross girls was by Lori Nighswander in the backstroke with a clocking of 1:14.71.

Ross boys sink Findlay 93-78

FINDLAY — It was a happy but sobering experience for Art Bucci.

The Ross swim coach was reveling in his boys team's 93-78 victory over Findlay, Bucci's first win as head coach over the Trojans.

"We beat Findlay and I think that is great," he acknowledged, "but I was not too happy with our swims. We have work to do."

While the Ross boys won, the girls lost 103-65.

The last time a Ross swim team defeated a Findlay squad was in 1973 in the Fremont Junior High School natatorium. Bucci was an assistant coach.

Ross swept the diving event to highlight the win. Ryan Nuhfer racked up 214.7 points for a Little Giants' first place while teammates Ty Weikert finished second and Jon Lagrou third.

Other firsts for the Aqua Giants came in the medley relay, butterfly and backstroke. Findlay had more firsts, but the Ross depth took its toll.

Tom McDonald grabbed a pair of individual firsts — the butterfly and backstroke — and swam a leg of the medley relay.

McDonald recorded a 56.4 in the butterfly and came back with a 58-flat in the backstroke. McDonald, Brian Mowry, Andy Scott and Bill Taylor comprised the medley team which finished in 1:47.4.

Julia Schaaf had the only firsts for the Ross girls, winning the 50 freestyle in 26.7 and the backstroke in 1:12.8. The latter time qualified her for the district meet.

"Our girls team is young," Bucci described, "and it will take it on the chops for a while before it gets established."

The Ross girls had seven seconds, including a pair by Tod Heslet in the 200 freestyle (2:15.98) and the butterfly (2:12.61).

Tina Streeter was second in the 100 freestyle (1:06.34) and Jamie Brudzinski was runner-up in the 500 free (6:16.8). Kathy Sabiers took second in the breaststroke in 1:23.2.

The medley relay team of Lori Nighswander, Sabiers, Heslet and Schaaf was second in 2:10.3 and the freestyle relay quartet of Brudzinski, Brenda Audorff, Lori Smith and Streeter was second in 4:31.2.
