Ross Swimmers Set New School Record In 200-Yards Relay Medley

Coach George Gruse's Ross high swimmers defeated Oberlin College Jayvees 55-31 Saturday at Oberlin and set a new school record in the process.

The foursome of Jack Talbot, Francis Sherman, David Carl and Gordon Tod won the 200-yards relay medley in 2:01.4 which is better than the Ross school mark of 2:02.2 set in the 1956-57 season.

Other first places for Fremont: Carl in the 100-yards butterfly 1:10.7 with Mike Cochran second. Tod in the 200-yards free style 2:20.4 with John Myers third. Talbot in the 100-yards backstroke (1:07.9); Jim Streeter in the 100-yards free style (0:60.0) with Don Slessman second.

Tom Trout, 174.35 points, and Jim Mooney, 138.8, were one and two in diving. Streeter was first (1:51.7) and Tom Long third in the 150-yard individual medley. The 200-yards relay went to Fremont (Richard Gwinup, John Schaaf, Robert Vogel and John Roush) in 1:47.

Sherman was second in the the 100-yards breaststroke won by Swanson of Oberlin in 1:17.7. Gwinup was second and Schaaf

third in the 60-yards free style won by Sachs of Oberlin in 0:26.2.

John Level, Ross high fullback, was named as one of six backs on the Northern All-Stars for the North-South all-senior contest next year at Canton.


An alternate choice in case any of the six are not available is halfback Jim Hailey of the Little Giants.

200-Yards Relay Medley Foursome Tops Old Mark

**Sherman Establishes
New Event Standard
In Win Over Sandusky**

A new school and pool record was set in the 200-yards relay medley and another in the 100-yards breast stroke by Ross high as the Little Giants captured their second swimming meet of the year in two starts, 52-34 over Sandusky high in the Ross natatorium Thursday afternoon.

Two weeks ago, the foursome of Jack Talbot, Francis Sherman, David Carl and Gordon Tod won the 200-yards relay medley in the time of 2:01.4 to set a new Ross school record. That was in the Little Giants' first meet of the year against Oberlin College Jayvees.

Yesterday, the same foursome splashed the distance in the same event in 1:58.8 seconds which not only broke the school record set at Oberlin but also cracked the Ross pool mark of 1:58.9 set by defending state champion Canton McKinley in 1936.

Sherman established the new school and pool mark in the 100-yards breast stroke in 1:16.2. It was a new event in the swimming program and, therefore, the winner Thursday automatically established a new standard. Race calls for swimmers to keep the arms under water instead of on top. It is a plain breast stroke instead of the butterfly.

Coach George Gruse was well satisfied with Ross high's showing and noticed considerable improvement over the performance against Oberlin's Jayvees.

Next meet for the Little Giants will be an January 9, 1938 at Marion. Team will practice on December 26, 27 and 28 during the holidays. There are seven meets scheduled for the Little Giants in January.

With two victories already under their belt, Coach George Gruse's Ross high swimming team hopes to add victims three and four this week.

The Little Giant splashers tackle the Marion "Y" swim team at 7:30 p. m. Thursday in the Ross natatorium and then go against Sandusky high at 2:30 Saturday afternoon in Sandusky.

Ross whipped Sandusky last month 52-34 and topped Oberlin college's Jaycees in the 1957-58 inaugural.

In the Sandusky meet, the foursome of Jack Talbot, Francis Sherman, David Carl and Gordon Tod broke the school and Ross pool record in the 200-yards relay medley in the time of 1:58.8. Old mark was set by defending state champion Canton McKinley in 1956 in the time of 1:58.9.



Coach George Gruse's Ross swim team won eight of the 19 first places.

Saturday at 3:30 p.m., Fremont, Sandusky high, Upper Arlington and Columbus Academy compete in a quadrangular meet in the Sandusky high pool, a new one to be used for the first time. Arlington was state runnerup in swimming last year.

New records set Thursday:

Jim Streeter of Fremont broke the school record in the 150-yard individual medley in 1:45.8 to break the old mark of 1:46.3 set by Jack Ross in 1952.

The 200-yards relay medley team of Ross consisting of Jack Talbot, Francis Sherman, Dave Carl and Gordon Tod, broke the pool and school record, the third time this year for the school mark and the second for the pool. Time was 1:57.4. The foursome, against Sandusky earlier in the season, won the event in 1:58.8 which topped the pool mark of 1:58.9 set by Canton McKinley in 1956.

Dennis Ruppert, Marion, won the 100-yards breast stroke in 1:13.7 to beat Sherman's pool and school record of 1:16.2 set this year. The event is new to swimming this year.

Carl won the 100-yards butterfly in 1:06.5 which was one second back of Benny Hayes' time of 1:05.5, a pool record set in 1941. Hayes' mark was the best in the state for 12 years.

Dick Gwinup of Ross won the 50-yards free style in 26.5 with Tom Prichard of Marion second and John Roush of Ross third. Joe Cochran of Marion was second and Mike Cochran of Ross third in the butterfly.

Talbot won the 100-yards back stroke in 1:06.2; Lowell Byrly, Ross, second; Dick White, Marion, third.

Powerful Canton McKinley, defending state swimming champions overwhelmed Fremont Ross 55-31 in a dual swim meet in the packed Ross natatorium Friday night setting three new pool records in the process.

One of the McKinley marks may be a new national high school record. The foursome of Tom Conrad, Henry Belden, Marty Mull and Jack Foster splashed the distance in the 200-yards relay medley in 1:49.9. Veteran McKinley Coach Ted Branin said he will submit the mark for national ranking. He said any time under 1:50 in the event is considered for national recognition.
