Ross Swimmers Capture District Title, 16th For Little Giants

Coach George Gruse's Fremont Ross swimming team wrapped up its 16th District swim title last night at Fowling Green State university, setting one new Northwest Ohio District record and repeating its 1957 triumph in the process.

In 25 years of swimming at Ross, the Little Giant tankers have never finished lower than second in the District.

Fremont won six events last night including a first in the 200-yard medley in the time of 1:57.6, a new record. Old mark, set by

Fremont last year, was 2:03.1. Ross high's medley members are Jack Talbot, Francis Sherman, Dave Carl and Gordon Tod.

Ross tallied 102 points, Sandusky high 83, Lima 40, Findlay 19 and Mansfield 12.

Another new record was set in the free style relay by Sandusky in the time of 1:38.0. Old mark of 1:41.5 was set by Sandusky in 1956. Record breakers were Peter Zorn, Mike Bennett, Chuck Lee and Dave Scott of Sandusky.

First four finishers in each

event qualified for the state finals scheduled next weekend in the OSU pool, Columbus.

Fremont's winners yesterday included the medley team, Tod in the 100-yd. free style, Tom Trout in diving, Talbot in the 100-yd. back stroke, Sherman in the 100-yd. breast stroke and Jim Streeter in the 150-yd. individual medley.

Sherman's time of 1:16.7 in the breast stroke also was a new record for the District since the event is a new one in swimming this year.

The game may be highlighted by a scoring duel between 6-2 junior guard Jerry Schrock of Green Springs and 5-9 sophomore guard Gary Lindsley of York. Schrock tallied 27 points in Springs' win over Woodville. Lindsley is believed to have set a new county tournament record with 37 points against Townsend. He hit on 15 of 21 field goal tries.
