Ross Bows In Track

Bowling Green defeated Ross 92-26 Tuesday afternoon in a dual track meet at Bowling Green. Ross won only one first place, by R. Brown in the mile run.

The Little Giants will travel to Fostoria today to meet the Redmen.

Brown's time in the mile run was 4:52. T. Koebel of Ross was second in that event.

Other second place finishes for Ross were J. Davis, 440-yard run; Brown, 880-yard run; Jack Ziemke, shot put; and Bailey, broad jump.

Bowling Green also won the freshman meet, 71-29.

Fostoria Edges Giants In Track, 62 To 56

Ross rebounded from a good whipping at the hands of Bowling Green Tuesday to battle Fostoria down to the wire in yesterday's match, losing 62-56 in the final event.

Ross trailed by a point going into the important mile relay that was won by Fostoria. Gary Bailey, who usually runs the relay for the Little Giants, was out of action with a pulled muscle.

John Ihnat, Ross coach, said

the locals had more spirit and hustle in the latest meet and he hopes the team is now on its way. Lorain will visit Fremont next Tuesday as Ross warms up for the big Night Relays on the 27th.

Clyde Second, Fremont Fifth In Tiffin Relays

Clyde tasted its first "defeat" of any kind this season when the Fliers finished second to Bowling Green in the Tiffin Relays. Fremont Ross was fifth. Clyde is riding on a seven - dual victory streak this year.

Team standings were, Bowling Green 52, Clyde 40, Tiffin 33, Bucyrus 23½, Fremont 19, Fostoria 18½, Shelby 12, Mohawk 6 and Bryan 4.

New records were set in the two - mile, 120-yard shuttle hurdles, 880 - yard relay, distance medley and mile relay. Bowling Green set the new mark in the two-mile relay with a time of 8:22.6. Bowling Green, which only last week won the Fremont Night Relays, also broke records in the 880-yard relay and mile relay with times of 1:33.3 and 3:34 respectively.

Bucyrus set a record of 7:55.8 in the distance medley and Clyde broke a record in the 120-yard shuttle hurdles at 62.3.

Clyde took three firsts and Fremont held two seconds and two thirds.

Ron Brown, Dick Hufford, Ken and Tom Koebel garnered a second for Ross in the two - mile relay and Brown, Hufford, Larry Kelly and Jim Davis picked up a silver medal in the distance medley.

NBA To Retain Present Set-Up

NEW YORK (AP) — For the time being, at least, the National Basketball Association is going to retain its present alignment, which leaves San Francisco and Baltimore still on the outside looking in.

That action, which amounts to no action, was all the league's stalemated board of directors could produce after more than 17 hours of deliberation and debate on a proposal to sell and transfer the Philadelphia Warriors to San Francisco.

"The practical difficulties of such a move at this time," was the reason given for the failure of the sale to go through when the directors broke up their 2-day meeting behind closed doors Friday.
