Fremont Ross Gains 3 Points In State On Show's 3rd Place

COLUMBUS, O., May 29—AP—Ohio high schools looked up to new track champions today, crowned during a test of speed and brawn which left last year's title holders far in the lurch.

Cleveland East Tech scored 35-1-6 points at the 32nd annual state scholastic meet here Friday and Saturday to nose out Columbus

Linta stole the show with a leap of 13 feet 9 7-8 inches to the old record of 13 feet 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches set by Maynard of Belmont high school, Los Angeles. The former state mark of 13 feet 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches was set by Don Whittaker of Sandusky in 1936.
