Ross, St. Joe absorb losses

Tiffin Columbian handed Fremont Ross its third consecutive loss and Tiffin Calvert spoiled St. Joe's season opener Tuesday.

In other matches, Oak Harbor won its Suburban Lakes League opener and Clyde won its initial Sandusky Bay Conference test.

Columbian posted identical 15-6 back-to-back victories over the Lady Giants. Diane Harms was credited with six points to top Ross.

In the junior varsity match, Columbian prevailed in straight 15-4 game wins.

The Columbian varsity is now 2-1 while Ross is 0-3.

At Tiffin, Calvert stopped the Lady Streaks 15-9 and 16-14. Jill Swint had eight points to top St. Joe in the Sandusky Bay Conference test.

The St. Joe JVs picked up a win, defeating Calvert 15-13, 9-15 and 17-15. Heidi House had 15 to top St. Joe.

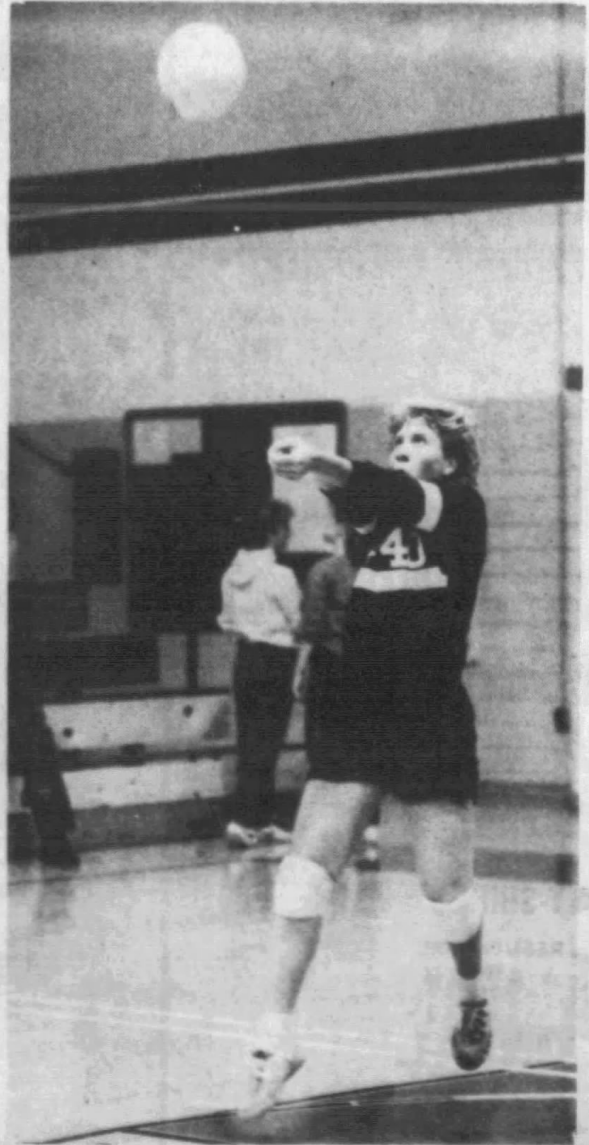
