Woodmore golfers win district title

The Woodmore Wildcat golf team is going to Columbus, but the St. Joe, Clyde and Port Clinton golfers and Ross' Dave Miller had their dreams of traveling south cut short in district competition Friday.

The Suburban Lakes League champion Wildcats won a sudden-death playoff with Ottawa Hills on the second extra hole to capture the Class A District crown at Hawthorne Hills in Lima. Both teams shot 320 in regulation.

Woodmore was led by Jason Vie Brooks' four-over 76. John Schaffer and Brian Neeb both shot 81s and Steve Korn added an 82 to round out the Wildcat scoring. Ottawa Hills will also be making the trip to the Scarlet course as a result of its second-place finish.

The St. Joe Streaks also played at Hawthorne Hills, but fell 35 strokes short to finish in ninth place.

Jeff Decker paced St. Joe with an 80. He shot a nine-over 45 on the front side and a one-under 35 on the back. Other scores for St. Joe were: Steve Spieldenner 96, Brian Tiell 87, Ron Darr 94, and Pat Furlong 94.

Individual qualifiers from the Lima district were Van Buren's Doug Martin with a 73 and Archbold's Dan Plassman with a 74.

Ross' Dave Miller shot a 74 at Detwiler Golf Course in the Toledo Class AAA District tourney, but that was not good enough to get the Little Giant golfer into the state tournament.

At the Findlay Country Club Class AA District, Clyde finished in a tie for seventh with Norwalk at 362 and Port Clinton came in last place with a 394. Lima Central Catholic won the tourney with a 334 and Bryan was runnerup with a 342.

Clyde's Bob Hohenstein missed being an individual state qualifier by one shot with his round of 81. Other Clyde scores were: Eric Crockett 88, Todd Young 94, Rob Palicka 99, and Troy Gooding 103.

For Port Clinton, John Delhees shot a 92, Bob Muggy had a 98, Dave Colston a 100, Dan Anspach a 104 and Terry Galway a 109.
