Ziemke Confident As Ross Meets. Lima Central At T.U. Tonight; Winner Plays In Regional Tourney

Fremont Ross, which has been able to win the closest games, and Lima Central, which has played the toughest schedule in the state, square off in the Toledo University field house at 7:30 tonight in a District Class A tournament game.

Bowling Green takes the floor against Defiance at 9 o'clock. The winners advance to the Regional tournament, joining Toledo Macomber, and the survivor of the Columbus District tournament. The Regionals will be staged next week in the T. U. field house, and the champion advances to the state finals in Cleveland the following week.

Coach Al Ziemke expressed satisfaction with the physical and mental condition of his squad after sending it through a light drill Friday. And the Little Giants' mentor was full of confidence, unusual for him.

"We Can Take Anybody"

"If we play ball we can take 'em," he declared. "As a matter of fact, I think we can take anybody in the state when we play ball. I'd just like to see a game where Miller, Doren and Baron were all hitting. We'd give someone a real licking."

The Giants have seldom clicked on all cylinders this season, but were able to pull game after game out of the fire when one individual would rise to great heights. In last week's Section final it was Dean Doren. Larry Miller was the star of the semi-final win over Tiffin Columbian. And that's just about the way it went during the season, although in tourney play subs Dick Harter and Charles Black made timely contributions in two close wins. Henry Tiller had a great night against Calvert in the finals, scoring an unexpected total of 20 points to assist Doren. Ted Houghtaling hit for four field goals in the last quarter to help the cause.

Miller, Doren and Jack Baron were hot against Marion, and the result was a 38-73 conquest, Mil-

ler scored 30, Doren 19 and Baron 25.

Lima is a playmaking club, while Ross is a free-shooting outfit. "We don't use a set offense," explains Ziemke. "It's up to each player to make his opening, get in position to shoot. I think we're hard to set up a defense against. We've been able to score plenty of points."

Lima can match Fremont in overall height. Forwards on both teams are 6-3 and 6-0. Ross has the tallest center, Dean Doren being 6-4 while Dan Hennon of Central is 6-2. However, Lima has a three-inch edge at the guard positions. John Henderson is 5-9 and Merrill Castle 6-0 for Lima, compared with 5-8 Jack Baron and 5-10 Ted Houghtaling, of Fremont.

Fremont's record is 17 wins and 3 losses, compared with Lima's 11-7, but the Dragon's have played what has rightfully been described as the toughest schedule in the state.

Dragons Won In Findlay

Lima has two impressive victories against teams that Fremont played. The Dragons defeated Findlay in Findlay by 10 points, while Fremont lost by nine points on the Trojans' floor after defeating them by eight in Fremont. Lima downed Fostoria, 64-54, while Ross was forced to the limit to gain 49-46 (in overtime) and 61-59 verdicts over the Redman.

John Henderson, a hard-driving 5-9 guard, is considered the Dragons' No. 1 player, but in the Bluffton Sectional, forwards Dick Dush and Bob Emmons won All-Tourney honors.

Lima Rolls Over Ross In 2nd Half; Bears Lose To Leipsic; Huron Nips Sycamore, 46-45

All Area High School Teams Eliminated In Basketball Race

The season is over for all Fremont area basketball teams. Both Fremont Ross and Gibsonburg lost "big ones" Saturday night. The Little Giants were eliminated in the Class A District tourney at Toledo by Lima Central, 72-60, while Gibsonburg stumbled in the Class B District at Tiffin, Leipsic winning a 61-45 decision.

The margins were substantial in those two games, but two Class B finals were decided by one point. The biggest surprise came at Mansfield when Huron, winner over St. Joe in the semifinals, nipped undefeated Sycamore, 46-45. Delphos St. John's snatched a Regional berth away from Delphos Jefferson, 50-49, on two free throws by Bob Kill in the last eight seconds.

Giants Lead By 10 In Second Period

Defiance upset Bowling Green, 60-49, in the nightcap of Toledo U.'s doubleheader after Fremont's hopes were shattered in the opener. Ross led by 10 points in the second quarter and for 12 minutes had everything its way. Lima Central became aware of the Giants' weakness on drive-ins around the key hole and before the half was over, held a one-point lead. Jack Baron's long shot in the last three seconds put Fremont ahead again at intermission, 33-32.

After Bob Emmons' fielder in the first few seconds of the second half, Lima never trailed again. Lima held an eight-point bulge, but spurts by Larry Miller and Dean Doren whittled the deficit to 46-43 at the end of the third period.

Lima led 57-49 with 5:22 to play and it was 62-51 with 4:05

remaining as the Dragons got hot to make good on nine of 12 field goal attempts in the final quarter.

Miller hit on jump shots and Doren was masterful in the pivot in the first half. Miller sank four fielders in the first eight minutes and Doren collected five buckets by intermission. It was apparent that Lima could not stop Doren from shooting, so after the half Lyle Barber's Dragon's concentrated on stopping passes into the 6-4 center. Neither Doren or Miller got off many shots in the last half, the Giants making most of their attempts from long range.

Tiller Out More Than Half

Fremont's Henry Tiller, rebounding ace, drew three personal fouls in the first quarter and was taken out. He didn't return until 4:30 to play in the final period with Lima leading, 59-49. Tiller committed two quick personals, the fifth with 2:55 left, and departed for good.

The playmaking Dragons were led by Emmons with 20 points. All five starters scored in double figures. Doren scored 22 points and Miller 21 for Ross. Fremont attempted 68 shots, made 23 while Lima sank 28 out of 61. Ross was tagged with a technical foul in the fourth quarter when Jack Baron failed to report to the scorer as he returned to action. The Dragons missed their free throw, but Emmons scored a field goal when they received possession at mid-court.

Defiance was rated an 8-point underdog but grabbed the lead early and never gave it up. Defiance held a 31-19 edge at the half and it was 43-33 heading into the fourth quarter. John Snyder and Jim Lehman each made 16 points for Defiance, while Phil Ward's 13 was tops for B.G. Defiance made 14 of 19 free throws.

The surprising Golden Bears of Gibsonburg led Leipsic at the half, 24-23, but the Putnam county champs grabbed a 37-33 edge in the third period and outscored Gibsonburg 24-12 in the fourth. Bill Warren tallied 19 points for the winners.

Gibsonburg, which was led by Curt Bowser's 16, played without Don Schlea, rangy guard who received a head injury in a fall to the floor during a victory celebration Friday night immediately after a sensational overtime conquest of Arcadia.

George Majoy's field goal and two foul shots in the last 30 seconds at Mansfield enabled Huron to derail Sycamore, which had won 27 straight. It was Huron's 20th win in 21 games, the only defeat being inflicted in season play by St. Joe.

Huron led 4-0 at the start, but fell behind after a 9-9 deadlock and trailed until Majoy's late blitz. Jim Armstrong scored 18 points for Huron, getting all 10 of
