The race for Buckeye Conference championships will be in full swing this weekend. Ross track and field team will venture to Mansfield Saturday for championships in those two sports. The polers will test Mansfield's Westbrook Coun-

The pole vault mark of 13'4 was set in 1963 by Jim Showers of Marion. Merlin Wilford of Marion has 13'7 and has set records in competition this year.

ROSS FINISHES WITH TWO POINTS:

Six Buckeye Records Fall, Sandusky's Lindsey Sets 3

MANSFIELD—Fremont Ross track men were lost in the scurry for records Saturday at the track meet. Taking advantage for the first time of the near-perfect conditions at Mansfield's new track, the Buckeye thinclads fashioned six new records.

Leading the record onslaught and winning the meet was Sandusky with 63 points. Ross took a fifth in the 880-yard relay and a fifth on a pole vault by Ron Roberts to earn only two points.

Bob Lindsey was the big story for Sandusky and the 11th annual Buckeye meet. The slender

runner was a triple winner, setting new records in all three events. Lindsey set standards in the 220-yard (:21.4), 100-yard dash (:09.9) and 180-yard low hurdles (:19).

Roberts equaled his Ross school record of 12.9, but was only good enough for fifth in an event in which the record was broken. Merle Wilford, Elyria, vaulted 13-3/4 to break the record of 13-1/8 set by Marion's Jim Showers in 1963.

Ross' 880-relay team was only four-tenths of a second off its season best at 1:35.4 in finishing fifth.

Tony Schnuerer, Mansfield, 120-yard high hurdles, :14.9 (New record of :14.8 in preliminaries broke mark of :15.2, set by Marion's Gary Warner, 1961).

John Dampier, Lorain Admiral King 22-8 1/4 (Old record, 22-2 1/2, Jim Brown, Sandusky, 1964).
