FREMONT GETS THIRD PLACE IN BIG MEET

The towering giants from Waite high school were given a rude shock when they started to count points at the completion of the big track and field meet at Sandusky Saturday, where ten high schools competed for honors. Waite, its football reputation a national boost, tried to repeat by mingling with Little Big Six teams on the field and track. They expected to be victors by an overwhelming count, but the real facts of the matter are, they had one tough time finishing second a few points ahead of Fremont's group of boys and way behind the pile of counters that Sandusky had heaped up.

Sandusky grabbed off 67 points, Waite $56\frac{1}{2}$, while Fremont garnered 42 of them things. Bellevue, also traveling in class A society, got $8\frac{1}{2}$ points. Norwalk won the class B honors with 493-4 points.

In the class A affairs, Sandusky qualified 13 men for the big gathering at Columbus next Saturday and Fremont will send Thatcher, Dieckert, McCarthy and Peters down to the doings at Ohio State's track.

Fremont failed to register a first but got four seconds and a flock of thirds. Thatcher of Fremont, tied with Crooks of Sandusky, for the high jump at 5 feet, 3 inches, and Dieckert of Fremont, was placed second in the mile jog that was won in 5 minutes and 2 7-10 seconds. McCarthy won second in the discus but was off form, according to those who saw, and should have taken down first. Peters was second in the javeline toss.

The Fremont athletes and Coach Taylor have every reason to be proud of their showing and they also report fine treatment at the hands of the Sandusky reception committee.
