Davis Honorable Mention; Rather On Second Team

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—Henry Burlong of Dayton Roosevelt, a 6-foot-6 17-year-old who scored at a 26.6 clip, was named Ohio's Class AA high school basketball player of the year today.

The Gem City giant led the voting by a hefty margin as coaches, sports writers and officials picked the annual Associated Press All-Ohio team from among the 9,000-plus players on 433 squads.

Selections were based on personal ability—not team records—and only one of the top five on the All-Ohio made it to this weekend's state tournament. Only pre-tournament performances were considered in the voting.

Wilson Graham of Cleveland East Tech's top-rated Scarabs moved up from last year's third team to the first five, and he'll be on hand for the big playoffs.

Rounding out the All - Ohio, which averaged 124.4 points per game, are Jim Myers of Defiance, Glenn Barker of Middletown's oft-beaten Middies and Eddie Spriggs of Jackson. The latter, the only junior on the team, led the scoring with a 30.8 average.
